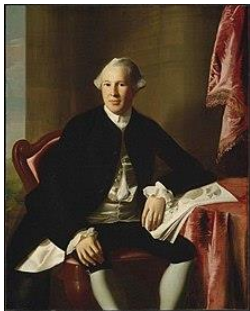

McNairy County

McNairy County was named Judge John McNairy, judge of the U.S. District Court for the District of Tennessee. The county is located in the southwestern area of the state.



Warren County

Warren County is located in the central area of the state. The county is named after Dr. Joseph Warren (1741-1775), "American Revolutionary War officer, who sent Paul Revere on his famous midnight ride." During the first two years of the county's existence court sessions were held at the home of Joseph Westmoreland and in a log courthouse built nearby on the east side of Barren Fork of Collins River
