

County Creation Dates & Parent Counties



Houston County

The Tennessee General
Assembly established
Houston County on
January 21, 1871, and
named it in honor of Sam



Houston, governor of Tennessee and hero of Texas. The people voted to establish the new county in 1871

because they were too far from their respective courthouses in Dickson, Humphreys, and Stewart Counties to properly conduct business. <u>Houston County Locality Guide</u>

Jackson County



Jackson County was named for Andrew Jackson, who by 1801 had already served as a U.S. Congressman and Senator from Tennessee, a Tennessee Supreme Court justice, and a colonel in the Tennessee militia. He became more widely known as commander at the Battle of New Orleans and as the seventh President of the United States. The

county is located in the central area of the state. Jackson County, named in honor of Andrew Jackson, was created by the Tennessee legislature in November 1801. It is the second oldest of the twenty-three counties named for Jackson in the United States; only Jackson County in Georgia is older.
