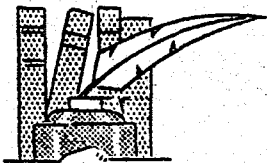


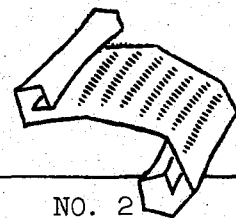

For your information the following Federal Census on microfilm have been added to the fine collection already at Cossitt through the cooperation of our Society and the Memphis Public Library:



We welcome another newcomer, and one that will be cheered because the records in this state are sometimes hard to find. It is the GEORGIA PIONEERS edited by M. H. Carter of Albany, Georgia. Vol. I, No. 1, published in February 1964, contains thirty pages of interesting material. Starting in this issue is a list of Revolutionary Soldiers and Widows of same who drew land in Lee County, Georgia in the lottery. TOOLS FOR RESEARCH:

MOBILE SHIP NEWS, Volume I, 1821-22, by Lois Dumas Mitchell, promises to be a welcome addition to the library of anyone seeking ancestors on the Gulf Coast. The volume is a reprint of weekly newspaper articles in the 1821-22 COMMERCIAL REGISTER OF MOBILE. These columns contained such vital source material as names of Captains, names and types of vessels, types of cargoes, and last but not least, the passenger lists. THEY WENT THATAWAY, by Charles Hughes Hamlin, is composed almost entirely of original courthouse records, powers of attorney, deeds of sales, wills, marriages, etc. from various Virginia counties with the citation of each item as to source and authority. The compiler hopes that his material will be of use in proving connecting link of settlers to and from Virginia. In many cases the information not only proves the name of the migratory individual, but also the names of parents, brothers, sisters, etc. Price per copy is \$10.00 from the compiler, P. O. #### POTPOURRI:

A note from our hard working member, Mrs. Robert Thornton of Rockwood, Tennessee, tells us that the Meigs County Courthouse burned on Tuesday, January 28. She said it has been stated that "county records" were saved, indicating all were saved. Mrs. Thornton thought out-of-state readers might be interested in knowing about this fire, particularly those who spend vacations doing research.

Mrs. Lon G. Ellis of Canton, Illinois, one of our subscribing members, wrote us the following in regard to a query she placed in ANSEARCHIN' last year: "I heard from the Gaughman query (1963-57). A lady in Arizona saw my query and wrote to Mrs. Bernice Olsem, Castro Valley, California, telling her to write to me because I was the authority on the Baughmans. The letter was forwarded to Mrs. Olsem in Europe. When she received it she was consulting with a famous genealogist, Dr. Wilhelm Fisher, concerning her Sager-Baughman families of Altershofen-Hessen, Germany. Mrs. Olsem is my sister ! The news got around."

Mrs. L. I. Showers, a member of long standing, sent the following tombstone inscriptions from a cemetery in the 1200 block of Avenue D., Hondo, Medina County, Texas: G. S. Johnson/born at Athens, Tenn./Jan. 17, 1824-June 4, 1890/Husband of Cynthia; Cynthia Johnson/b. in Ala./Aug. 25, 1826-Aug. 24, 1892/wife of G. S. Johnson; Infant son of J. M. & Pearl Johnson/born & died July 18, 1894; Florence Johnson/dau. of J. M. & Pearl Johnson/July 15, 1895-Jan. 14, 1899; Julia Johnson/ Oct. 14, 1887-April 4, 1904/16 yrs. 6 mos.

Mr. Clarence Hart of Ridgecrest, California, retired recently and now devotes some nine hours a day, six days a week studying family records in an effort to trace the lineage of the first Harts in Connecticut and New Jersey in the 17th century down to his own great grandson. Through this work, Mr. Hart contracted other members of the family, and they in turn put him in touch with a sister he had not seen in 48 years! She had spent as much as \$1500.00 at one time trying to locate Mr. Hart. An article and picture in the TUSCON DAILY NEWS show the very happy reunion.

Mr. Talbot Feild of Texarkana, Arkansas, writes in regard to the article we ran last year about "Tennessee Graveyards in Davidson County." He says no mention was made of the TALBOT GRAVEYARD located about 3½ miles east of Nashville on the Thos. Talbot farm. The stones have been destroyed, but buried there are: Thos. Talbot, a Revolutionary Soldier, his wife, Ruth Greer (dau. of Andrew Greer and sister of Joseph Greer), and Eli Talbot, son of Thos. There is also the tomb of Thomas H. Fletcher and wife, Sarah, dau. of Thomas and Ruth Greer Talbot. Lack of space keeps us from printing more on subject.

ANCESTORS ARE WHERE YOU FIND THEM:

From ANCESTRAL NOTES FROM CHEDWATO, Vol. 11, 1964, p. 1: "LAND GRANT-P. O. Box 746, Burlington, Vermont

State of Tennessee #5676, Warren Co., Tenn. volume B (1812-1819) granted to JAMES WALKER assignee of heirs of John Cowan - p. 140 ... in consideration of military services performed by John Cowan to the State of North Carolina Warrant No. 5094, dated December 6, 1797, and entered August 20, 1807, by No. 118, there is granted by the State of Tennessee unto James Walker, assignee of the heirs of the said John Cowan a certain contract or parcel of land containing two hundred acres, part of said Warrant in Warren County in the Third District on Collins River ..... Surveyed the 17th of July 1811 by Isham Perkins, D. S. Title guaranteed. In witness whereof Willie Blount, governor of Tennessee hath set his hand and caused the great seal of the state to be affixed at Nashville on June 5, 1814 ....."

From ANCESTRAL NOTES FROM CHEDWATO, same as above, p. 7: JOHN B. MITCHELL of Obion County, Tenn., was shot dead while sitting at table in his own house surrounded by his family, on the night of the 3d inst. The murderer is alleged to be JAMES N. BROWN, 'a heavy built man, near six feet high, hair and eyes black, visage rather broad, a large scar across his nose, which is rather angling downward.' A considerable reward is offered for his apprehension."

See THE COLORADO GENEALOGIST, Vol. XXV, No. 1, p. 22 for A MURRY RECORD which 1130 Penn St., Denver, Colorado contains a Bible record of one JOHN F. MURRAY, b. 1837 Big Creek Gap, Tennessee. Campbell County in the Sequatchie Valley was the seat of this family of Murrays, some of whom moved to Sulphur Springs, Ala., others to Nebraska and Missouri.

Also, see THE KANSAS CITY GENEALOGIST, Vol. IV, No. 3, p. 1, for a well documented treatise on a WITHERSPOON family of Iredell Co., N.C. During Revolutionary times, to Sumner County, Tenn., thence to Rutherford and Wilson Counties, Tenn., thence to Newton County, Mo., and finally to Ellis County, Texas. Mrs. Will Miller, Box 175, Corsicana, Texas is the author.

And from THE MURPHREE MONTHLY, Vol. 1, No. 6, p. 34: "The records of Sullivan, 181 "U" St., Salt Lake City, Utah

Hickman, and Rutherford Counties, Tenn., are full of references to the sons of DANIEL (MURPHREE) of Orange-Chatham Cos., N.C. Several of the N. C. sales of land show residence in Tenn..... The Hardy Murfree family was in Rutherford, but there were also others whose names correspond with those of Daniel's sons ..... Apparently Daniel's sons went to Tennessee and thence to Alabama. There are also MURPHYS AND MURPHEYS by the same first names as Daniel's sons at the same time in other Tennessee counties, and they may be really Murphrees, as we find the name spelled both ways in both North Carolina and Virginia."

PLEASE NOTE AND CHANGE: In the January 1964 issue of ANSEARCHIN', line two on top of page 8, your editor accomplished with words what could not be done with a bulldozer. She managed to move Jackson County, Oregon to the State of Washington (some 400 miles away)! #### ROSS FAMILY RECORD

The following is a copy of a family record made in August 1884 by John Henry Ross. He was a Methodist minister of Cooper County, Missouri. The original record is in the possession of a grand daughter, Mrs. R. G. Smith, Smithston, Missouri, and was copied for us by Mrs. J. C. Dodd of McAllen, Texas.

James Ross was born in Ireland and moved to America when about nine years old and settled in Virginia. His wife, Mary Mitchell, was from England. Henry, son of James and Mary, born 1780, married Martha Dickey, died 1845-48. His wife having died 20 years before. Both died in Illinois near Rock Springs. Mitchell Ross, son of Henry and Martha, was born in 1801 on August 21, Logan County, Kentucky, and moved to Tennessee when three years old. He married Polly Hillhouse, daughter of John Hillhouse and Bethiah Sharp.

John Hillhouse was son of James born in Ireland and Molly Dickey. "Martha Dickey wife of Henry Ross" was daughter of Robert Dickey and Peggie Hillhouse, sister of James Hillhouse.

John Henry Ross, son of Mitchell Ross and Polly Hillhouse, was born Nov. 25, 1825, in Lawrence Co., Tenn., near Lawrence (Lawrenceburg?), moved to Missouri with parents, Mitchell and Polly, in 1828, and married Hannah Eliza Headlee, October 25, 1849.

Elisha Headlee and Mary his wife were supposed to have been born in North Carolina. Their son Daniel, born in same state, married Jane Homes Steele, daughter of Samuel and Jane Steele. Jane Steele was daughter of Irish parents named Reed.

And your Petitioners in duty bound will ever pray on.

## MEMBERS OF POND CREEK BAPTIST CHURCH, MONROE COUNTY, TENNESSEE, 1824-1860

Compiled by Mable H. Thornton (Mrs. Robert E.), Rockwood, Tennessee

The "Minutes of the Pond Creek Baptist Church November 1824 --October 1860" have been microfilmed and are available from the Historical Commission, Southern Baptist Convention, Nashville, Tennessee. The minutes state that the church was organized November 20, 1824 at John Howel's in McMinn (but now located in Monroe) County, Tennessee, by Elder William Jones and Elder Thomas Mosby (?). In July 1832 they reported to the association a total of 17 members. The minutes refer to sister churches at Paint Rock, Sweetwater, Clear Springs, Hopewell, Prospect, and Concord.

The minutes state in January 1837 that a "Record of Deaths" would be kept thereafter, but very few deaths were recorded. No record was kept of marriages, but the minutes contained references to wives and maiden names of same.

The following list of members and statistical data was compiled from the minutes and compared with the six statistical lists contained in the book. Except as noted, statistics have been grouped as "Received" (including baptism) and "Dismissed." Numerous members were excluded and restored to membership, but restoration of membership is not always noted. This list contains only a few references to proceedings against members since frequently the proceedings were lengthy and the decisions were not always clearly defined. In January 1837 several members were "Erased" for having joined the Missionary Bible Society, and in December 1844 another group was "Excluded" for having joined the Campbellites. Other examples which called for "Dismissal from Fellowship" may be found under Dickerson Morris and Hugh Wilson.

The minutes contain no entries for the period March 1, 1857 to August 1, 1860. A portion of the film covering January 1837 to May 1837 could not be read with accuracy. The terminology as well as the nature and amount of details recorded varied according to the discretion of the church clerk. Therefore, this compiled list cannot be considered to be complete.

PENSION CLAIM AND SUIT FOR BOUNTY LAND FOR MARTHA MILLER, WIDOW OF HENRY MILLER  
W-5377 and BL WT 2469-100

The Declaration states: Martha Miller, age 87, was a resident of Blount Co., Tennessee, who appeared in said court on 10 December 1845 and said she was the widow of Henry Miller, a soldier in the Continental Line in the State of North Carolina in the Revolutionary War. He served three years as an enlisted private. She further declared that at the time of his enlistment he resided in Meclenburg (sic), North Carolina, and that she was married to the said Henry Miller in Rutherford County, North Carolina, in the year 1774. She said her near neighbor, Mr. James Wyley, was present at the wedding. She also said her husband, Henry Miller, died in the year 1820 and that he was a resident of Roane County, Tennessee, at the time of his death. The Declaration was witnessed by Wesley Earnest, Justice of the Peace.

There is an affidavit by James Wyley (signed Wyly) of Blount Co., Tennessee, stating he was present when Martha and Henry Miller were married; that Martha and family lived with him for some three years while Henry was absent fighting in the Revolution; that Henry Miller came to the State of Tennessee in the year 1800 and settled himself and family in Roane County. This was witnessed the 10th December 1845.

The proceedings were approved in the January 1846 term of County Court, and signed by Samuel Price, W. Toole, and S. J. Reynolds.

The Certification from the State of North Carolina, Office of the Secretary of State shows Henry Miller was a corporal in Capt. Blount's Co. of the Fifth Regiment for the term of the war, that he was a corporal on the 1st of February 1780, and a sergeant in 1782. A Land Warrant was issued for his service in May 1784 for 1,000 acres. Signed by Wm. Hill, Sec. of State.

Included in the papers is a statement by Dobson Miller of Roane County, Tenn., made on January 21, 1852, stating that he was the son of Henry Miller, who was a soldier of the Revolutionary War. He said his father died in 1820, leaving a widow, Martha, who died 22nd December 1848, Roane County, Tennessee. His Mother left the following named children as her only heirs-at-law: James Miller, Elizabeth Davis, Isabelle Hankins, and Dobson Miller. The declaration was made in order to obtain the balance of pension due his Mother up to the date of her death. E. W. Breazeale, Justice of the Peace for Roane Co., attested to the above statement.

Dobson Miller gives power of attorney to Taze. W. Newman of the Town of Knoxville, Tennessee, to bring suit against the General Government of the U. S. for the amount of Bounty Land due the heirs of Henry Miller. This is witnessed by Wm. F. Seay, a Justice of the Peace, and W. Sands.

The Certificate of Pension was issued the 20th day of February 1852 and sent to Hon. G. W. Jones, H. of R.

CARROLL COUNTY, TENNESSEE (continued from January 1964):

SELLER GRAVEYARD,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles north of Clarksburg on state highway, 7 miles south of Huntingdon Courthouse, between Huntingdon and Clarksburg, established in 1859 by Seller, contains 100 graves.

SHILOH GRAVEYARD, 4 miles east of McKenzie, 15 miles northeast of Huntingdon on Shiloh Road between McKenzie and Huntingdon, established 1830 by Thomas Hamilton, contains 100 graves. Thomas Hamilton, Charter Elder, and John C. Smith, who preached here five years and died in 1830, are buried here. This was known as a religious society. C. P. Church was organized in 1830.

SHILOH METHODIST CHURCH GRAVEYARD, 1 mile east of Whitthorne on Denny Highway from Milan to U. S. Highway to Cedar Grove, 20 miles west of Huntingdon Courthouse, established in 1815 by John Shepherd with 360 graves.

SNEAD GRAVEYARD,  $11-3\frac{1}{4}$  miles northwest of Huntingdon,  $\frac{3}{4}$  mile south of McKenzie,  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile east of Austin Peay Highway, established in 1886 by Garland Snead, discontinued in 1895, 6 graves.

SPELLINGS GRAVEYARD,  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile west of business section of Buena Vista on Buena Vista and Butler's Schoolhouse Road, 10 miles east of Huntingdon Courthouse, established in 1852 by John Spelling with 360 graves.

TERRY FAMILY GRAVEYARD, 14 miles south of Huntingdon Courthouse on the old State Road, 9 miles southeast of Whitthorne, between Huntingdon and Jackson, Tennessee, established in 1851 by Col. John B. Terry, 23 graves. The Terrys, Cloptons, and McKinneys are buried here.

TREZEVANT GRAVEYARD,  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile east of post office in Trezevant on Austin Peay Highway, between McKenzie and Atwood, and 15 miles northwest of Huntingdon Courthouse, established in 1865 by Capt. W. A. Marshall of Trezevant.

TUCKER GRAVEYARD, 1 mile west of business section of Westport on Westport Road, 9 miles southeast of Huntingdon Courthouse between Huntingdon and Westport, established in 1860 by A. C. Tucker, 125 graves.

UNION ACADEMY GRAVEYARD, 7 miles west of Huntingdon, 3 miles east of Bramley Highway between McKenzie and McLemoresville, Tenn., established in 1839 by William Newbill, 60 graves. When organized this was a Primitive Baptist Church but was later changed to Missionary Baptist Church.

VICKER FAMILY GRAVEYARD, 3 miles south of Huntingdon Courthouse on Purdey Road, between Clarksburg and Huntingdon, established in 1853 by Tobe Vickers, 25 graves.

WILDER FAMILY GRAVEYARD, 7 miles west of Huntingdon,  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles southeast of Austin Peay Highway between Trezevant and Huntingdon, established 1859 by C. Wilder, 50 graves.

ZION GRAVEYARD (CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN), located near Newbill's Crossroad, 8 miles west of Huntingdon, near Bramley Memorial Highway, between Trezevant and Huntingdon, established 1845 by John Norman, 150 graves.

GIBSON COUNTY, TENNESSEE:

ANTIOCH METHODIST CHURCH GRAVEYARD, 12 miles northeast of Trenton, 2 miles southwest of Lynnpont,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles west of Trenton and Greenfield Highway, established prior to Civil War by Jerry McKenzie, 800 graves. Jerry McKenzie and his son, N. I. H. McKenzie, and wife are buried here.

ANTIOCH PRESBYTERIAN GRAVEYARD, 12 miles northeast of Trenton, 2 miles southwest of Lynnpont,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles west of Trenton and Greenfield Highway, established prior to Civil War by Jimmie Hamilton, Sr., 150 graves.

BEECH GROVE BAPTIST GRAVEYARD, 5 miles northwest of Trenton on old Trenton and Dyersburg Road, 3 miles west of Trenton and Dyer Highway, established 1867 by Zack Biggs, Sr., by deed to deacons of Beech Grove, W. L. Holt, et al, 75 graves. Judge Jas. B. Biggs was the first child born in Gibson County. He was born September 11, 1824. He was chairman of the County Court for a number of years until his death January 19, 1895. He was the first person buried in this cemetery.

BELLS CHAPEL BAPTIST GRAVEYARD,  $14\frac{1}{2}$  miles northwest of Trenton,  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles west of Rutherford on Rutherford to York Road.

BELLS CHAPEL GRAVEYARD (CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN), 18 miles northwest of Trenton, 4 miles northeast of Yorkville between Rutherford and Yorkville, on the Rutherford and Yorkville Road, established in 1887 by H. B. Reed for the above named church.

BERRY FAMILY GRAVEYARD, on old Berry farm, 2 miles north of Trenton,  $\frac{1}{4}$  of mile east of Trenton and Keely Mill Road, which is a graded dirt road that intersects Poplar Grove Road at Callis and-Barron's Store, established 1837 by John S. Berry, discontinued 1898, 100 graves. The farm on which this cemetery is located was settled by John C. Berry, grandfather of C. C. Berry, who was a trustee of Gibson County in 1939, only 11 grave stones found.

BETHPAGE GRAVEYARD (BAPTIST), 25 miles northwest of Trenton, 7 miles southwest of Kenton, Rutherford and Mason Hall Road, established October 23, 1886 by William Woods and wife by deed to above church.

BETHPAGE PRESBYTERIAN GRAVEYARD, 19 miles northwest of Trenton, 4 miles north of Tatum,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles north of Rutherford and Trimble Road.

BLAKEMORE FAMILY GRAVEYARD,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles west of Trenton on Trenton to Dyersburg Road on W. H. and Andrew Lussiter farm, established prior to Civil War, discontinued 35 years ago, 15 graves, located in a pasture and there are no tombstones.

BLUES CHAPEL PRESBYTERIAN GRAVEYARD, 20 miles northeast of Trenton, 5 miles northeast of Idlewild, 10 miles north of Milan on the east Milan to Bradford Road, also known as Gann Road, established in 1874.
