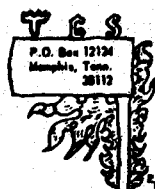

In an earlier 1968 issue, we advised members of the death of Mrs. G.W. Hutcherson of Lubbock, Texas. We can now report that her research books, notebooks, etc., were presented to the library of the South Plains Genealogical Society and are now available to interested persons in the City-County Library there. Dorothy Rylander, President of S.P.G.S., reported their group is making a drive to see that such material will be preserved upon the death of the compilers, and not destroyed by uninterested heirs.

The Old State House at Markham and Center Streets in Little Rock, Arkansas, houses the historical and genealogical collections of the state government. It was the State House from 1836 to 1910, a beautiful example of southern classical architecture. The archives of the Old State House include many items of interest to genealogists, including a large microfilm collection of old newspapers, over 600 early tax books on the county level, rare maps, early state publications and a large number of portraits of distinguished Arkansans. The printed genealogical collection is poor, but there are many original records which are only available at this depository. The Old State House reference library is open Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The Museum is open at various times for the convenience of the public. Inquiries should be addressed to the Arkansas History Commission, Old State House, Little Rock, Arkansas 72201.

THE BOOK CORNER

HENRY COUNTY, TENNESSEE, OLD TIME STUFF (By Edythe Rucker Whitley, 1604 South Observatory Drive, Nashville, Tennessee 37215. 123 pages. 1968 \$10.00.)

This compilation will represent the latest work from Mrs. Whitley who is a true dean of Tennessee genealogy with over forty-five vigorous years in the field. She has forgotten more history and preserved more genealogy than most self-styled "certified" genealogists will ever know or do. Mrs. Whitley has once again happily combined history with genealogy in these Henry County abstracts. This county has always been one of the leading areas of West Tennessee. Its records are a literal gold mine for genealogists, but the indices of the originals in the courthouse at Paris are negligible. Mrs. Whitley has abstracted several of these records, including many early wills, deeds, legislative petitions and marriages. The 1840 and 1883 pension lists for veterans of our wars are given in detail, and there are numerous family sketches in this volume, especially a lengthy Walker genealogy. The book is thoroughly and well indexed. Anyone with a Henry County genealogical background should begin with Mrs. Whitley's book. It will save the searcher many hours of tedium and frustration.

ABSTRACTS OF EARLY DEEDS OF EDGECOMBE COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA, VOLUME 2 (Compiled by Joseph W. Watson, 406 Piedmont Avenue, Rocky Mount, North Carolina 27801. 365 pages. 1967.)

A worthy successor to the first volume of this series, this hardbound book of abstracts will save a small fortune in research fees for those persons who need deed abstracts from the Edgecombe area. The deed records have been abstracted from 1772 to 1788, a vital period in North Carolina land ownership. A revolutionary time politically, it was also a time when men were trying to secure safe title for their real estate. This volume is carefully and methodically indexed by deed book, of which four were abstracted. A typical entry is:

"DB 4-22. Articles of Agreement between William (x) Ellinor and Thomas Ellinor of Edgecombe Co., Nov. 5, 1783, Whereas Francis Ellinor, Sen., in his last will and testament bequeathed to his two sons, Thomas Ellinor and Francis Ellinor, Junr., a certain tract of land containing 340 acres to be equally divided between them...."

TOMBSTONE INSCRIPTIONS AND FAMILY RECORDS OF JEFFERSON COUNTY, OHIO (Compiled by Esther W. Powell, 36 North Highland Avenue, Akron, Ohio 44303. 1968. Hardbound, 201 pages. Index. \$15.00.)

It was with a sense of mission that the compiler tackled the tedious but rewarding task of taking names and dates from the tombstones in older Jefferson County cemeteries. She knew full well the toll taken by the oldest monuments, often the only sources of information on the vital statistics of ancestors before 1870. The cemetery records are listed by separate cemeteries in given townships, as for instance: Chestnut Grove, Monroeville Area, Pine Grove, and West Point cemeteries are listed in Brush Creek Township. There are excellent township maps in the book, making it relatively simple to locate cemeteries. The entries given for each are alphabetically listed with all pertinent detail being given, as: Carrothers, Robert, 1758-1821, Proprietor of Mt. Pleasant. There are many annotated minute-biographies for those persons buried in Jefferson County.

TENNESSEE MURPHYS-MURPHEYS AND ALLIED FAMILIES, Volume I (By Marion E. Murphy, 5309 Marlborough Drive, San Diego, California 92116. 1968. 29 chapters, appendix, bibliography, and family name index.)

This is the kind of genealogy that readily engages the attention of anyone interested in people. That is what this genealogy concerns - people of all sorts and varieties.

George Murphey (1745?-1831), whose 3200 descendants are the subjects of this compilation, would surely be proud of this accurate, documented, logical and well written account of his family. The Murpheys dealt with were first in Pittsylvania County, Virginia. They later moved to Tennessee and Arkansas. Their histories and those of 460 other surname candidates are awarded plenty of space and detail in the book. Those of you who may be working on the format of your projected family histories might do well to check this book as a good example, beginning with the author's personally charming preface.

HISTORY OF CHRISTIAN NAMES (By Charlotte M. Yonge. MacMillan Co., 1884; republished by Gale Research Co., Book Tower, Detroit, Michigan 48226. 1966. Glossary. \$13.50.)

Yonge's highly regarded book on surname derivations with historical backgrounds, really a standard in the field, has been reprinted finally. The text is wonderfully encyclopedic in scope: the romance as well as the science of surname research is fully evident in the 476 pages of this reference work. It is valuable in genealogical studies because of its emphasis on the national backgrounds of names, both given and surnames. Many leads as to ancestral origins lie nuggetted within this delightful book. Examples of titles from the book are: Names from Roman Deities; Modern Names from the Latin; The Keltic Nomenclature; Teutonic Names; Descriptive Names; etc.

MARRIAGE RECORDS OF TUSCALOOSA COUNTY, ALABAMA, 1823-1860 (Compiled by Pauline Jones Gandrud. Published, 1968. The Milestone Press, 494 Williamsburg Lane, Memphis, Tennessee 38117. Index. 192 pages. \$15.00.)

As Tuscaloosa County was an original Alabama county taken from the Indian Territory, and as it was the partial parent of Marion, Greene, Pickens, Walker, Fayette and Hale counties, these early abstracts are especially valuable. The abstracts incorporate several marriage books. Most helpful are the Index to Brides, and the Index for the Justices, Ministers, Parents, etc. The grocms are arranged alphabetically. A typical abstract entry shows the parties, date of license, date of marriage and officer: "Acker, Alexander and Nancy Moses, 30 Dec. 1833; 2 Jan. 1834 by E. McMath, J.P."

THE 1840 CENSUS OF THE REPUBLIC OF TEXAS (Edited by Gifford White, 1 Pemberton Parkway, Austin, Texas 78703. 1966. 236 pages. Index. \$15.00.)

This publication certainly represents one of the most invaluable research tools for genealogists looking for information concerning the location of Texas pioneers. A state-wide tax was levied by Texas in 1840 (by law passed, 1837). Every male above the age of 21 was required to be enumerated on the tax lists. The result is the only census taken of Texas before 1850. Gifford has abstracted all the known 1840 county tax lists by name, polls, land claimed and other property. A splendid county map of the Republic of Texas in 1840, precedes the tax accounts in the book. It would be difficult to fault this hardbound, attractive, very readable and accurate volume.

LIST OF OFFICERS OF THE ARMY OF THE UNITED STATES, 1779-1900 (Compiled by Col. W.H. Powell, originally printed in 1900. Republished by the Gale Research Co., 1400 Book Tower, Detroit, Mich. 48226. 1967. 863 pages. Index. \$37.00.)

This listing is accurate, as the names of the thousands of officers involved were taken from the War Department rosters and other official records. There are twelve separate lists for the years 1779-1814. These are followed by a 545 page section for those officers serving from 1815 to 1900. Other lists are for the Civil and Spanish wars, Generals of the Revolution, etc. This is a marvelous research tool for genealogists as well as for historians. Genealogically it will give a thorough military abstract for an officer: "Caldwell, Green W. - Born in N.C. Appointed from N.C.

Asst. Surg., 13 July 1832. Capt. Inf., 3 March 1847; 3rd Drag., 9 April 1847. Disbanded 20 July 1848."

A GLOSSARY OF TERMS USED IN HERALDRY (By Henry Gough and James Parker. Originally printed in 1894. Reprinted in 1966 by Gale Research Co., Book Tower, Detroit, Michigan 48226. 658 pages. Index. \$14.50.)

The time when a knowledgeable genealogist could ignore heraldry is long past. Heraldry, the art and science of "coat-of-arms," has a most elaborate technical language. The Gough and Parker Glossary is a definitive study about this language, the terms with which most every genealogist must become aware in order to analyze the significance of armorial bearings. The heraldic terms are listed alphabetically. These are further explained by illustrations, of which there are 1,000 in this beautiful book. The paper of this edition is remarkably durable, printed on acid-free "300-year" paper.

HARDIN COUNTY, KENTUCKY, MARRIAGE BONDS, 1792-1812 (Compiled by Mary H. Stancliff, 9643 Meadowvale Drive, Houston, Texas 77042. 1964. 103 pages. Index. \$7.50.)

Hardin County is the parent of Ohio, Breckenridge, Grayson, Daviess, Meade and Larue counties, partly of Edmonson and Hart counties. Therefore, this well printed and accurately compiled abstract of marriages is especially valuable for genealogists working that part of early-day Kentucky.

NELSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY, MARRIAGE BONDS, Vol. 1, A-J, Vol. 2, K-Z, 1785-1832.
(Compiled by Mary H. Stancliff, 9643 Meadowvale Drive, Houston, Texas 77042. 1962 and 1963. Index. Each Volume \$10.00.)

Nelson County was the parent of many of the Ohio-Western counties of Kentucky. The original marriage bonds of Nelson being so vitally important, are nonetheless difficult of access and hard to read. Therefore, these abstracts are valuable timesavers, as well as being carefully prepared and interestingly presented records.

THE TWENTIETH CENTURY BIOGRAPHICAL DICTIONARY OF NOTABLE AMERICANS: BRIEF BIOGRAPHIES OF AUTHORS, ADMINISTRATORS, CLERGYMEN, COMMANDERS, EDITORS, ENGINEERS, JURISTS, MERCHANTS, OFFICIALS, PHILANTHROPISTS, SCIENTISTS, STATESMEN, AND OTHERS WHO ARE MAKING AMERICAN HISTORY.

(Boston, The Biographical Society, 1904. 10 Vols. Corrected edition of **THE CYCLOPEDIA OF NOTABLE BIOGRAPHICAL DICTIONARY (1900-1903)**. Republished by Gale Research Co., Book Tower, Detroit, Michigan 48226. 1968. \$130.)

A scholarly contribution to the field of biography, this series remains a significant gold-mine for genealogists with ancestors who were notable in their professional and private lives from the foundation of our country until the turn of the present century. The famous naturall find their way into the pages of this series, as they would generally in any such study, but the thousands of less-well-known but active, worthwhile people who have made significant contributions to the fibre of this country are also well-covered therein. Many people will find their ancestors and kinsmen included among these biographical sketches, thereby getting numerous leads to their more remote ancestry. Each biography is awarded adequate space for the details of importance in his (or her) life: birth, place of birth, parentage, children, death, etc. These "lives" are often illustrated with personal photographs, coat-of-arms, and residences.

This attractive set would be a delightful addition to any library whose owner collects with discerning taste in Americana.

PERSONAL AND FAMILY NAMES, A POPULAR MONOGRAM ON THE ORIGIN AND HISTORY OF THE NOMENCLATURE OF THE PRESENT AND FORMER TIMES.

(Glasgow, Thomas D. Morison, 1883. 362 pages. Index. Republished by Gale Research Co., Book Tower, Detroit, Michigan 48226. 1968. \$15.00.)

Another book of the Genealogy and Heraldry series from Gale, this genealogical tool is of immense value for genealogists who are interested in the derivation of given and surnames. The author listed each type of name, its definition, and many of its variants, and much etymological detail generally. An example of an entry:

"Charles means whatever Carl, Churl formerly, meant - strong with a flavour of roughness which time has rubbed out. We say 'Tom cat,' the Germans say 'Carl cat.'"

SOME OF THE DESCENDANTS OF PHILIP SHERMAN, THE FIRST SECRETARY OF RHODE ISLAND.

(By Dr. Roy V. Sherman, 824 Mechanics Street, Emporia, Kansas 66801. 1968. 586 pages. Index. \$12.50.)

A colorful, attractive genealogy, this Sherman work is especially valuable for the extensive coverage given on the family in its ancient English background. It is doubtless a definitive genealogy of a multitude of Philip Sherman's descendants. The format is sensible and quite easily followed throughout.

THE SOCIOLOGY OF COLONIAL VIRGINIA.

(By Morris Talpalar, Second Edition. 1968. 447 pages. Index. Order from The Philosophical Library, 15 East 40th Street, New York, N.Y. 10016. Price \$8.75.)

The reviewer has never read a more vivid or more interestingly written social history of the Old Dominion in her colonial period. Among the topics covered, well and research accurate, are the British-Colonial, the Puritan Domination, Puritans vs. Cavaliers, Indentured Seritude, and Slavery. Any genealogist with a multitude of Virginia ancestors should have this book to consult, to pore over and through, in an attempt to understand his colonial ancestors and their social milieux.

CHARLES CITY COUNTY, VIRGINIA, ORDER BOOK, 1676 - 1679.

(Compiled by Margaret McNeill Ayres, 632 S. McLean Blvd., Memphis, Tennessee 38104. Priv. Pub., Memphis, 1968. 135 pages. Index. Price \$7.50.)

The CHARLES CITY is an abstract book above par. Its format and extensive (and understandable) abstracts are most sensibly done. The record searcher was careful in her wording, making certain that the reader can understand just what legal process was being undergone in specific instances, i.e., lawsuits, divorces, levies, etc.

The old Charles City court met at Westover on the James, and many interesting colonial Virginians are found on the pages of this volume. It has special interest for those persons who are looking for the roles their ancestors played in the recent Baconian Rebellion, as, occasionally, some Bacon supporter would appear in the old court order book. The index is one of the best the reviewer has ever seen in an abstracts compilation.

OLD HOMES AND BUILDINGS OF AMELIA COUNTY, VIRGINIA. VOLUME I.

(By Mary A. Jefferson. 1964. 160 pages. Index. Order from the Herald, Farmville, Virginia 23901. Price \$7.50.)

TENNESSEANS IN TEXAS

(Abstracted by Miss Barbara J. McNamara from

"A Memorial And Biographical History of John and Hill Counties, Texas"
published by The Lewis Publishing Co., Chicago, 1892)

JAMES M. Rogers, Irene, Texas, was born in Perry Co., Ala., May 14, 1826, and is the seventh in order of birth of nine children born to Benjamin and Martha Rogers, both natives of Ga. The father was a farmer, and died in Miss., in 1844. After his death his widow came to Texas and located in Limestone Co., where her death occurred in 1862. Their children were named in the order of their births as follows: William F., died while serving in the war, (he left a large family in Limestone Co.); John, also served in the Confederate army, and was killed at Vicksburg. He left six children: J.M. (subject); Jefferson served in the Southern army, and is now residing in Limestone Co.; M.C., a farmer, now residing in Limestone Co.; Betsey A., married Stuart McDonald, and three of her sons served in the army, one being killed; she and Mr. McDonald are now deceased; Mary, married George Pollock, and resides in Miss.; Martha married Ed. Pollock, who died in Limestone Co.; she had gone West; Sarah married Mr. Alexander and now resides in Indian Territory. James M. Rogers was married in 1844. In 1853 he came to Texas and settled first in Freestone Co., where he remained three years, engaged in carpentering and cabinet-making. From there he moved to Limestone Co. for fifteen years, then moved to Navarro Co. in 1866; and in 1870 he came to Hill Co. In 1862 he enlisted in the cavalry, and promoted to the rank of Colonel. Returning home he resumed his farming operations. Mr. Rogers' wife, whose maiden name was Harriet Germany, was a daughter of John Germany, a native of Tenn., who moved to Miss. at an early day, and died there in 1863. To Mr. and Mrs. Rogers have been born eight children: Mary E., born in 1846, and married W.A. Hunter, a farmer of McLennan Co.; James A., born in 1849, resides on a farm in Hill Co.; Sarah, born in 1852, is the wife of W.W. Woodruff of Hill Co.; Jefferson H., born in 1854, resides in Hill Co.; Lou was born in 1861, and married J.G. White, of Hill Co.; Thomas, born in 1865, is at home; W.C., born in 1857, of Greene Co.; and Cornelia, born in 1868, and died in 1880. The mother of these children was born December 24, 1829. During the war Mrs. Rogers' sister and the latter's husband died, leaving six small children unprovided for. Mrs. Rogers took the orphans into her home and reared both families as though one. (p631-3)

CALVIN L. HUTCHESON, of Johnson Co., was born in Tenn. in 1839, a son of William and Margaret (Sigler) Hutcheson, natives also of Tennessee. The Hutcheson family are among the early settlers of that State, and are of German descent. The Sigler family are also among the early settlers of East Tennessee, and Philip Sigler, the grandfather of our subject, was among the prominent men in the settling of Bledsoe county. William Hutcheson was a farmer and country merchant. He was the father of nine children, as follows: Philip, deceased; Charles, of Johnson Station, Tarrant Co.; W.C., of Tenn.; G.W., deceased, whose family reside in Hood Co., Texas; J.L. of Arlington, Tarrant Co.; O.P., of Callahan Co., Texas; Frances, deceased, was the wife of A.K. Middleton, of Johnson station; Irena, wife of E.S. Day, of Wise Co.; and C.L., our subject. The father died when our subject was only one year old, and the mother afterward married Henry Gotcher, and came to this State in 1867, where she died ten years later. C.L. Hutcheson formed a partnership with his brother, W.C., at Georgetown, Tenn., in the mercantile business, until the war. In August, 1861, Mr. Hutcheson joined the First Tenn. Cavalry; after the war, clerked in a dry-goods store in Atlanta, Ga., and in Dec. 1866, came to Alvarado, Johnson Co. He was married in 1866 to Miss Mollie Luttrell of Hamilton Co., Tenn., and a daughter of C.D. and Abbie (Teener) Luttrell. The father was one of the early settlers of Hamilton Co., and was one of its leading farmers and slave owners before the late war. Mr. and Mrs. Luttrell

had seven children, viz.: James D., a resident of Harris Co., Ga.; John, deceased, whose family reside in Tenn.; William H., of Harris Co., Ga.; J.G., deceased, but his family reside in Alvarado, Texas; Martha, deceased, was the wife of Dr. Atchley, of this city; and Mary, wife of our subject. Mr. and Mrs. Hutcheson have had four children: William L., attending the Baylor University at Waco; Abbey, Maggie and Gertrude, at home. (p637-8)

ASTYANAX M. DOUGLASS, M.D., is a son of Dr. James S. Douglass, who was born in Sumner Co., Tenn. in 1806, and later became a resident of Osceola, Mo., where he resided until 1848. He then returned to Tenn. near where the city of Union now stands and died in 1849. He began practicing medicine in 1835, and continued the same until his death. In 1836 he came to Texas with a volunteer company. He was a son of Alfred H. Douglass, who was one the pioneers of Tenn. from Va. His wife was a Miss Scurlock, a native of Va., and by her he became the father of four sons and one daughter: Thomas C., who now resides in Waco, Texas, was for a number of years Judge of Sumner Co., Tenn.; Young Elmore, deceased, of Sumner Co., Tenn.; David, who was known as General David Douglass, was at one time Mayor of San Francisco and was a lawyer by profession; the next is Dr. James S., the father of the subject of this sketch; and Caroline, who became the wife of Thomas G. Miller of Bastrop, Texas, is now deceased. Dr. James S. Douglass was married to Miss Caroline Mills, who was born in Sumner Co., Tenn. in 1810 and died in 1841. She was the daughter of Captain John Mills, a native of Va., and a very wealthy planter of Sumner Co., Tenn. His wife was a Mrs. Hartgrave, of Ky., a widow with four children when he married her, one of whom, Jerry Clemems, was United States Senator from Alabama just prior to the war. John Mill's parents were Virginians. Dr. Astyanax M. Douglass was born in Sumner Co., Tenn. in 1838, and until the death of his mother he made his home with his parents, but afterward with his maternal grandfather, John Mills. A few years later he went to live with an aunt, Mrs. Ann Sanders, remaining with her until twenty-one years of age. He first located in Rankin Co., Miss., but soon enlisted in the Confederate army. In 1866 he came to Texas. He was married in Feb. 1868, to Mrs. Lottie A. Wier, a daughter of Colonel James J. Gathings. Mrs. Douglass was the widow of Captain Joseph P. Wier. She has borne Dr. Douglass the following children: Astyanax M.; James G.; John S., and Frank M. living: and Cartha C., Benjamin C. and Lottie A., dead. (p638-0)

JOSEPH H. WOMBWELL'S father, Joseph H. Wombwell, Sr., was born in Va. in 1823, but moved from there to Florida, where he remained until his death in 1859. He was married January 1859 to Miss Elizabeth P. Pope, who was born in Florida in 1837, and who was the daughter of William S. and Harriet Pope. Her father was sent to Fla. by the Governor, as Indian agent. To Mr. and Mrs. Wombwell was born but one child, Joseph H. The paternal grandfather, Dr. Joseph H. Wombwell, a physician, was a native of the Old Dominion, and of English descent. Joseph H. Wombwell, Jr. was born Sept. 14, 1859, in Fla. When 21 years of age, he came to Texas, and first located at Fort Worth. He came to Itasca in 1890. In 1886 he married Miss Martha A. Smith, a native of Fort Worth, Texas, born in 1864, and the daughter of Junius and Mary E. Smith. Mrs. Wombwell died the 27th of March, 1891, leaving one child, Elizabeth. (p640-1)

D.M. MATTHEWS, of Hill Co., Texas, was born in Tishomingo Co., Miss. March 1, 1844, the fifth of the nine children of William M. and Jayne (Phillips) Matthews, natives of Tenn., the father, now resides in Johnson Co., Texas. In 1862, D.M. enlisted in the Twenty-sixth Mississippi Volunteer Infantry. At the close of the war, he went to his brother's at Pleasant Site, Ala. In 1868, he came to Texas settling in Hill Co. In 1872, he was married to Miss R.E. Nunn, of Powhatan, Arkansas, and they had one child, Willie Carl. The wife and mother died in 1881, and in 1882 he was married to Miss R.F. Gaines, of Mississippi. (p641)

OLIVER P. ARNOLD, was born in Spartanburg, S.C. in 1826. His father, William B. Arnold, was born in that State in 1803; moved to Tenn., thence to Mo., and from there

in 1847 to Texas. Arriving in this State, he first located in Titus Co.; in 1859 settled near Cleburne till a few years prior to his death, when he moved to the city of Cleburne. He died at the latter place in 1873. Mr. Arnold's mother's maiden name was Mary Fryer, her native place Spartanburg, S.C., and the date of her birth 1803. Her parents were married in 1831, and to them were born seven children, viz.: Amanda M., a widow of M.B. Kouns, is a resident of Cleburne; Oliver P., Cynthia J., widow of Levi Lewis, a resident of weatherford; Marion, who was killed at the age of 20; Absalom M., a farmer of Johnson Co.; the sixth-born died in infancy; and the youngest, Puss, died when two years old. Mr. Arnold's paternal grandfather, James Arnold, was a native of Va.; served in the war of 1812; died in S.C. His grandmother Arnold was before her marriage a Miss Blundell. Oliver P. Arnold came to Texas with his parents in 1847. In 1853, he went to California, remained on the Pacific coast until 1859, and then returned to Johnson Co. He enlisted in 1861, but, being in poor health at the time he enlisted, was discharged after a year's service and returned to his ranch in Johnson Co. He was elected Sheriff of Johnson Co. just after the war and served till 1876. In 1861, Mr. Arnold married Miss Abigail Winchester, a daughter of Isaac and Mary Winchester and a native of Mo. Her death occurred in 1884. To Mr. and Mrs. Arnold, 12 children were born, namely: Harrison, a farmer of Johnson Co.; Olie I., of Johnson Co.; John A.; Mary E., wife of John A. Barkley, of Arizona; Lee, Alberta, Fannie and Nannie, at home; and George, Hood, Byrd and Oatis, who died when young. (p647-8)

JOHN WESLEY SMITH is a son of Eric and Jane Smith, natives of Va., the former born in 1774 and latter in 1784. They moved to Tenn., where the father died, in 1858. They were the parents of ten children, whose names are as follows: Julia Ann, wife of B.E. Estis, both deceased; Mary, wife of G. Milstred, also both deceased; George W., deceased; James, a resident of Shelby Co., Texas; Nancy, widow of John Swader, of Tenn.; Deliah, wife of Albert Fultz, of Easton, Texas; John Wesley Smith; Elizabeth, deceased, was the wife of William Morris, of Shelby Co., Texas; Sarah, who resides in Tenn.; Rosa, widow of William Hobbs of Tenn. John Wesley Smith was born in Tennessee in 1825. In 1847, he came to Texas and first located in Shelby Co. For two years Mr. Smith lived with his brother-in-law, Mr. Estis, who came to Texas in 1836. In 1862, he enlisted in the Twenty-eighth Regiment. He served until the war closed, and then settled in Johnson Co., eight miles southeast of Cleburne. (At that time Cleburne was known as Camp Henderson.) In 1887, he moved to his present location, where he has since resided. In 1852 Mr. Smith married Ann Cooper, who was born in Tenn. in 1834, daughter of Joseph and Elizabeth (Landers) Cooper. Ten children have been born to them, John, Elizabeth, Philip and Sarah are deceased. The fifth and sixth died in infancy. Caroline is the widow of Joseph Hughs, and resides in Johnson Co. Moreman lives on his fathers' farm. George and Joseanna are the youngest and are at home with their parents. (p648-9)

DR. JAMES M. PRATT, of Hill Co., Texas, was born in Gibson Co., Tenn. Sept. 2, 1856. His parents are John M. and Sarah V. (Smith) Pratt. The former was a native of Orange Co., N.C., where he was born in 1832. Grandfather William C. Pratt was also born in N.C., of English descent, and served for a number of years as Clerk of the Courts in his native State. The parents of James M. Pratt were married in Tenn. in 1854 and had ten children: James M., Zachariah, Jasper, Robert, Cora, Elbert, Arthur, Pearl, Edward and Essie. He practiced his profession for a couple of years in Madison Co., Tenn. after which he went to New York City. In 1882 we find him in Texas, where, after prospecting for a time, he finally located at Oak Valley, in Hill Co., but later, settled three miles from Aquilla, in the same Co., where he has since resided. Dr. Pratt was married, in 1879, to Miss Mollie L., a daughter of Colonel J.M. and Louisa Caruthers, of Madison Co., Tenn. Dr. and Mrs. Pratt have five children: Ethel May, Maud D., Maggie, Johnie M. and James A. (p652-3)

Nelson made bond to prosecute his case 31 May 1823 with William Hall his security.

To the Honorable the Chancellor....your Orator, Elijah Nelson of the County of Knox... Tennessee...on 29 Jan. 1821 he purchased of John Bright of said county...land in Knox County...462 acres on the waters of Bull Run, being part of Henderson and Company's survey...in Raccoon Valley...\$500. in three notes the last due 25 Dec. 1823...represented by Bright and a certain Joseph Love that he had a clear title...(Nelson moved to the land)...Bright only had title from a sheriff's sale and Joseph Love was the sheriff....A man called (blank) Buck who resides in Kentucky has been in this state claiming title to said land...some of the heirs of one William Dry who resides in Georgia or South Carolina set up a title to the land...prays to have the contract annulled or that John Bright be called to prove his title to the land...

John Bright's answer...let Nelson examine the title papers who expressed satisfactionRespondent bought the land in 1807 at the sheriff's sale as he thought for one Charles McClung of Knox County but McClung not being desirous of the purchase the land was left in his hands....Respondent applied to Joseph Love after the sale to become associated with him in the ownership...to pay the taxes and Love agreed...Elijah Nelson lost the case.

Pages 246-249 December Term 1826

John Bright vs John Longmire, John Wallace and Rebecca his wife

John Bright made bond to prosecute his case 18 Feb. 1822 with Julius Frazier his security.

To the Honorable the Chancellor....your Orator, John Bright, of Knox County... Tennessee...that about 15 years ago or longer, 5000 acres of land in the Grant to Henderson & Company was advertised and sold for taxes. Your Orator became the purchaser and in due time received a deed from the sheriff of Knox County. 25 June 1818 your Orator sold...to John Longmire, 300 acres part of said 5000 acres...\$100. to be paid in two notes of \$50. each...gave Longmire a bond for title when the notes were paid...Longmire sold one half of the 300 acres to Rebecca Norton of Anderson County, who is now married to a certain John Wallace. (Longmire had only paid \$2., Bright had brought suit and obtained judgement.) Longmire now lives on the line between the counties of Claiborne and Campbell...refuses to give up the title bond or pay the notes...Wallace and wife also refuse to surrender the land...The land was in Anderson County, Tennessee. The Court decreed that if the \$100. was not paid the land would be sold to pay John Bright and the costs of his suit. It was sold to John Purris who was buying for John Bright.

Pages 250-257 December Term 1826

Thomas Butler vs Britton Cross

Butler made bond to prosecute his case 5 May 1824 with John Rector and Robert

Galbreath his securities.

To the Honorable the Chancellor....your Orator, Thomas Butler, a citizen of Anderson County...Tennessee...in the year 1814...borrowed of Britton Cross \$310....agreed to pay back with \$15. interest 1 Jan. 1815. Your Orator secured the loan by delivering to Britton Cross a negro boy slave named Sam...twelve years old...delivered to him a bill of sale...only given as a pledge or security. Cross gave an obligation to re-deliver the negro when your Orator should pay back the loan...refuses to give up the slave...Butler also claims the hire of the negro...

Britton Cross answered 11 Nov. 1824...did buy the negro boy named Sam...denies there was any loan mentioned...Said Complainant came to the house of Respondent he brought with him the said slave and then and there told Respondent that he was about going into the Army and that he wished to sell the boy...raising money to equip himself. Later Butler complained whereupon Respondent agreed to sell the boy back to him in four months for \$325. Complainant assented...and procured his son in law, Reuben Williams, to write an instrument of some kind for this respondent to sign....up to present date at no time has he tendered the said sum much less at the time stated...

Britton Cross swore to his answer before William Tunnell a justice for Anderson County, 10 Nov. 1824

Bill of Revivor filed 3 April 1826 by Thomas Butler

Thomas Butler...humbly complaining...represents that on 5 May 1824 he filed his bill in this Court against Brittain Cross...the cause was continued from time to time until some time in November 1825 when the said Brittain Cross departed this life leaving his wife Polly Cross his sole executor of his last will and testament....prays to revive the case against Polly Cross the executrix...

The Court dismissed the case and Thomas Butler appealed it to the Supreme Court of Errors and Appeals to be held in Knoxville in July. He made bond with Richard Oliver and Richard Luallen his securities.

"THE ILLUSTRATED ATLAS & HISTORY OF YOLO COUNTY, CALIFORNIA, 1879

John D. Lawson, a native of Jackson Co., Tenn., was born 15 July 1832, son of Joshua Lawson, born 4 Apr. 1804 in Jackson Co., Tenn. When eight years old, he moved with his parents to Sheridan Co., Mo. (family records call it Chariton), town of Keithville. He moved to Sierra Co., Cal. in 1852 and in 1853 was in Yolo Co., Cal. where he married 13 Sept. 1855, Jane Browning. Their children, all living in Woodland, Cal., were: Genoa, William H., James B., Robert G. and Edward. Mr. Lawson engaged in farming near Woodland until 1862. He served as Under Sheriff and then as Deputy Sheriff for four years. In 1873, he was elected County Recorder and served two years.

Jane Browning, born 1831-died 1922, was the dau. of Charles Browning, born 4 Feb. 1799 in either N.C. or S.C. (records differ), died 6 Nov. 1861 near Woodland, Cal.; and Elizabeth Crawford, born 4 Nov. 1803 in either Cumberland or Monroe Counties, Ky. She was the dau. of James Crawford and Ann Hibbitt(s). Her birth place is given as Ky. or even Ireland by various Browning family accounts. Jane Browning gave her birth place as Tompkinsville as did several of her brothers and sisters, but evidence is clear that the Charles Browning residence was actually in Jackson County, Tenn. within the Kentucky land grant area.
