# NOTES FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK

Well, it's that time again. I had hoped to have this one out before now, but at least, it is not as late as last issue. The next one should be on time. Thank you for your indulgence.

We asked you to write to your senators and I certainly hope you have. The Bill to open all census records 75 or more years old to the public with a legitimate reason for searching them is before the Senate now. We urge you to write to the President of the United States, Gerald Ford, as well as to Senator Frank E. Moss, the sponsor of the Bill S3279. Personally write or type your letters. Be brief, writing only on one page. Tell them you are in favor of the bill which would make the Federal Census Records available for historical, medical, and genealogical research. Also, tell them you are in favor of the Census Records being placed in the custody of the U. S. Archivist, rather than the Bureau of Census.

Request your Senators to use their influence in removing the bill from committee and to actively support it's passage in the Senate.

#### WESTBROOKS FAMILY

William Westbrooks, born Salsbury, England in 1801, came to Virginia in 1818. On Nov. 24, 1825, he married Nancy Murray in Fluvanna County, Virginia. Their issue:

- 1827 Frank, killed by a horse in Ala. as they came to Tenn. about 1848.
- 1829 Richard Boon, thought to have gone to West Tennessee with an exodus of people from Versailles, where they lived at that time.
- 1833 Almira F., buried in Mount Pleasant Cemetery in the churchyard.
- 1835 William Calvin, born Albemarle Co., Va., buried in Westbrooks Cemetery, in Rutherford Co., Tenn. (contributors grandfather)
- 1836 Sally, buried in the 10th District of Rutherford Co., Tenn., about midway between Rockvale and Versailles.
- 1838 John W. W., buried in Westbrooks Cemetery.
- 1841 Martha J., buried in open field on the Mount Pleasant and New Town road in Rutherford Co., Tenn.

All were born in Virginia and all buried in Tennessee, except Frank. It is not known where Richard Boon is buried.

William and Nancy are buried beside Sally, who never married, between Rockvale and Versailles, Tenn., in the 10th District, Rutherford Co., Tenn. (Westbrooks Cemetery is between Link Store and Old Leb Church, 14th District, Rutherford Co.)

## BOOK REVIEWS

MOTTOES AND BADGES of Families, Regiments, States, Townes, etc. by W.S.W Anson. 1904. Reprinted 1975. Hard backs. Over 192 pages. Indexed. *ORDER FROM:* Gale Research Co., Book Tower, Detroit, Michigan 48226. \$15.00.

This book is a reprint of the 1904 edition. The mottoes and badges are British and foreign with translations into English of the foreign examples. Occasional notes attempt to trace the mottoes that are quotations to their sources. The Biblical quotations in Latin which illustrates the mottoes are from the Vulgate.

CONCISE UNIVERSAL BIOGRAPHY. Volumes I through IV. Edited by Sir J. A. Hammer-ton. 1934-35. Reprinted 1975. Hard backs. Two books containing over 1452 pages. Contents alphabetized. *ORDER FROM:* Gale Research Co., Book Tower, Detroit, Michigan 48226. \$58.00 both books.

The Volumes record the lives of over 20,000 famous men and women of all countries and all times. The books are well illustrated with authentic portraits and other pictorial documents. The two books consist of Volumes I through IV.

THE AMERICAN GENEALOGIST. A Catalogue of Family Histories, 5th Edition. Edited and prepared by Joel Munsell's Sons, Publishers. Albany, N.Y. 1900. Republished by Gale Research Company. 1975. Hard backs. Over 406 pages. Entire book alphabetized by families. *ORDER FROM:* Gale Research Co., Book Tower, Detroit, Michigan 48226. \$18.00.

The publication is a bibliography of American Genealogy or a list of the title pages of books and pamphlets on family histories published in America from 1771 to date (1900). However, the families are mostly New England with a scattered few from other states especially Virginia. A few foreign families and a few biographical works, not strictly genealogies of American families are included.

THE McINTURFFS (McINTURF, McENTURFF, McENTARFER) by Raymond L. Kringer. 1976. Soft backs. Over 353 pages. Indexed. *ORDER FROM:* Raymond L. Kringer, 16 Quinton Hill, St. Louis, Mo. 63137. \$15.00 pp.

The McInturff name is established as of German origin and the author claims this is the most complete account of the family ever written. The family in America originated from Johannes McInterfeer and Phronek Meckinturfer, husband and wife. Evidence proves that they were progenitors of John McCanturf who died in Shenandoah Co., Va. in 1779, Daniel McEnturf, who died in Fayette Co., Pa. in 1803, and George Macenterfer, who died in Stark Co., Ohio in 1822. The McInturff name underwent several changes from the original German version and as the families spread south, southwest and west variations appeared. From 1729 in the two and a half centuries the name has spread widely as did many other pioneer names. This book is well compiled and contains military records, cemeteries, and tombstones. Other states with this name: Va., NC., TN., Ohio, Ind., Ill., & beyond.

CEMETERY RECORDS OF MONTGOMERY COUNTY, TENNESSEE. Volume II. Compiled by Darnell, Jones, Alley, and Hogan. 1975. Soft backs. Over 130 pages. Indexed. *ORDER FROM:* Ann Evans Alley, Route 1, Box 76, Adams, TN. 37010. \$8.50.

Volume II is a nice little record of the cemeteries of Montgomery Co, Tn. The book is well done and could be useful to searchers looking for their ancestors from Montgomery and surrounding counties. there must be a Volume I of which Volume II is a follow-up work. Approximately 154 cemeteries listed and approximately 675 names.

THE DESCENDANTS OF JOHN HUTCHINS OF NEWBURY AND HAVERHILL, MASSACHUSETTS. Compiled by Edwin Colby Byam, Ph. D. Edited by Jack Randolph Hutchins. 1975. Hard backs. Over 545 pages. Name and Geographical indexes. ORDER FROM: Jack R. Hutchins, 23 Orchard Way South, Rockville, Maryland 20854. \$10.00.

The early Hutchins originated in England. John Hutchins was one of the first of the name in America and New England. His name first appeared in the Ipswich court record of Dec. 1641. Many Hutchins were emigrants to America and the name was plentiful in most of the colonies. John's will, dated 1674, is found in the Registry of Probate of Essex County, Mass., Volume 304, page 164. He mentions sons William, Joseph, Benjamin, Samuel and daughter, Elizabeth Ayres and Love Sherburne and appoints wife Francis as sole executrix. Twelve generations are reviewed in twelve chapters.

THREADGILLS IN AMERICA, A COLONIAL VIRGINIA FAMILY. Compiled by Janis Heidenreich Miller and Dr. Francis Dycus Threadgill, collaborator. 1971. Hard backs. Over 182 pages. Indexed. ORDER FROM Compiler, 4329 - 46th St., N.W., Washington, D.C. 20016. \$14.00.

The Threadgills of present day can be traced to Capt. Thomas Threadgill of the Georgia Continental Line in the Revolutionary War. The name is a variant of Threlkeld who came from the English-Scottish border. The Threadgills arrived in Va., in the early 1700's and have remained a southern family. Prior to 1900 they spread to NC., SC., ALA., GA., TN., MS., ARK., and Texas. The earliest record of the family is the will of Deodatus Threlkeld in 1728 and in 1732 his wife, Sybil, who signed her name as Threadgall. The name of Threadgill seems to have evolved after arrival in America of the Threlkeld family. Nine generations are shown. Sources of information are given.

AMERICAN AND BRITISH GENEALOGY AND HERALDRY, A Selected List of Books. Second Edition. Compiled by P. William Filby. 1975. Hard backs. Over 467 pages. Indexed. ORDER FROM: Order Dept., American Library Association, 50 East Huron Street, Chicago, Illinois 60611. \$25.00.

The book presents to American and Canadian libraries a selected list of books needed to meet the wants of genealogists and family searchers. It is a reference manual for librarians which will also act as a selection aid for them. The publication is divided into sections: general references, such as bibliographies, records, guides, indexes, periodicals, series, biographies, censuses, atlases, maps, manuals, and aids, colonial and precolonial lists, immigration, religions, military and pension lists. Areas: New England, the South and Indians. Individual states: a list of publications pertaining to the Eastern and Midwestern States, Mexico, Canada and its territories, England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales and former and present British dominions. A large section is given to publications on Heraldry. Finally, a long list of publishers.

WILLIAMSON COUNTY HISTORICAL JOURNAL No. 7, Tenth Anniversary Edition, 1966-1976. Published by the Williamson County Historical Society. 1976. Soft backs. Over 127 pages. Indexed. ORDER FROM: Mrs. Clyde Lynch, Route 5, Franklin, TN. 37064. \$4.25.

Williamson County is one of the most Historical counties of the state of Tennessee. The county historical society is well represented by the Williamson County Historical Journal. This middle Tennessee publication and its monthly letter is one of the outstanding county publications of the state. The 1976 copy contains twelve original articles by twelve different authors. All of these articles are local history in content. Some families included in the articles: Frost family, Wilkins Whitfield family of Williamson County, Collin McDaniel's letter, Some Early Settlers on Arrington Creek.

DEEDS OF FRANKLIN COUNTY, GEORGIA, 1784-1826. Abstracted and compiled by Martha Walters Acker. 1975. Hard backed. Over 560 pages. Indexed. Order from: *The Southern Historical Press, P. O. Box 738, Easley, SC 29640 or from Mrs. Wm. M. Acker, Jr., 2504 Watkins Circle, Birmingham, ALA 35223. \$30.00*

Franklin County, Ga. was established in 1784 from Cherokee lands. The county is on the Savannah River and across from Oconee Co., South Carolina. It has been reduced in size several times by changes in boundary lines so that searchers may have to look in the archives of adjacent counties to find certain people from Franklin originally. Twenty-eight deed books dating from 1786 to 1826 have been abstracted and compiled over a five year period. Copies of Franklin County deeds may be obtained from the Georgia State Archives at Atlanta.

URIAH SHERRILL ALLESON AND NANCY CLARK COX, *Their Ancestors and Descendants, 1500-1975*. Compiled by Margaret McNutt Morton. Soft covers. Over 290 pages. Indexed. ORDER FROM: *Mrs. Roy J. Morton, 416 Rockwood St., Rockwood, TN 37853. \$17.50.*

The author has written a story of her great-grandparents who were residents of Roane County, Tennessee by going back to their ancestors who were the original immigrants to Virginia. She has names both paternal and maternal predecessors. The publication is a usable and comprehensive genealogy of a notable pioneer family. Footnotes reflecting sources of "proof", many wills. Well illustrated.

THE EARLY BETHEL'S AND THEIR DESCENDANTS by Virginia Mohler Garde. 1976. Soft backs. Over 237 pages. Indexed. ORDER FROM: *Mrs. Edward Garde, Route 3, Box 327A, Edwardsville, ILL 62025. \$15.00.*

It is not known for sure whether the origin of the Bethels was Wales or Scotland. However, the family spread to the remainder of the British Isles and then to America. They are found in almost every part of the Union. The author is concerned, primarily, with the Bethels of Virginia. It is not surprising that she found Bethels (Bethells) in many places. The many pictures and family lists attest to a work well done. A unique feature is the list of Bethels who served their country in her wars. The contents show four sections to the book: (1) Bethells in England, Virginia, and Kentucky. (2) Sampson Bethell-Mary Cantrell line. (3) NC Bethells. (4) Various Bethel families. Yours just might be here.

MARYLAND ELDER FAMILY AND KIN, William Elder 1707-1775, Emmitsburg, Maryland Pioneer by Sister Mary Louise Donnelly. 1975. Hard covers. Over 325 pages. Indexed. ORDER FROM: *The author, 9525 Lyra Court, Burke, VA 22015. \$15.00*

The author did research on the Elder families of Maryland, Kentucky, and Texas. Some of the results she published in the "Genealogy of Thomas Hill and Rebecca Miles" in 1971. The present compilation is of the author's work along with other people's research. She gives special credit to Dr. Richard Dyer Mudd, M. D., author of the two volume edition of the "Mudd Family of The United States". William Elder married Ann Wheeler, a Catholic, and they moved to western Maryland, probably to avoid persecution. William was probably born in Calvert Co., Maryland in 1707. His father was William Elder and his mother was Elizabeth Finch, dau. of Guy and Rebecca Finch. Records of William and his brother, Thomas, are plentiful in the Maryland counties. Children of William and Ann were: William, Charles, Guy, and Richard. Those of William and Jacoba Clementina Livers were: Elizabeth, Arnold, Ann, Thomas, Ignatius, Francis and Aloysius. The book follows the children and their descendants wherever they went, as much as possible.



A FAMILY HISTORY, WRIGHT-LEWIS-MOORE AND CONNECTED FAMILIES by John Wright Boyd. 1968. Hard covers. Over 731 pages. Indexed. ORDER FROM: The author, P. O. Box 298, Tignall, GA 30668. \$20.00.

The book gives a detailed history of the first Wright, Lewis, and Moore families in America. The Wright family from Va., NY, and Md., The Lewis family from Va. and Ga., the Graham-Hall families of NC and Ga., and the Moore family of Va. and Ga. were the early progenitors of these people. Perhaps, one of the most useful sectors of the book for genealogists looking to Ga. are the photographs of the scrapbooks (184 pages) of Rosa Lee Wright Boyd which contains family pictures, newspaper articles, history and early membership of White Plains, Ga. Methodist Church, Bible records, Lewis and Wright Cemeteries, feature articles, and pictures of several prominent persons.

A FAMILY HISTORY, Lt. Thomas Fortson (1742-1824) and Some of His Descendants, Early Settlers of Elbert County, Georgia by John Wright Boyd. 1975. Hard covers. Over 943 pages. Indexed. ORDER FROM: The author, P. O. Box 298, Tignall, GA 30668. \$20.00.

The name of Fortson has been spelled in many ways by various officials who spelled by sound. Some spellings are: Fortson, Fortsen, Forson, Forsan, Forstan, Forsen, Forston, Fosson, Foston, Floreson, Foysen, and Fourson. Often different spellings are found in the same instrument. This was common in the early days of our country. Thomas Fortson and his wife, Mrs. Elizabeth (Winn?) Richards of Carolina County, Va. were the parents of William and Lt. Thomas Fortson, Jr. William and family moved to Lexington, Ky.. He and his wife, Mrs. Mildred Marshall Ferguson, had a large family. Lt. Thomas married Rachel Winn and moved to Elbert Co., Ga. from Orange Co., Va. in 1792. This couple had six children: Benjamin, Elizabeth, William, Richard, Mildred, and Jesse. The author has devoted a chapter to each of these children and their descendants.

A GENEALOGICAL HISTORY OF ONE BRANCH OF THE LONDON FAMILY IN AMERICA SINCE 1636. William Henry London: His Ancestors, Close Relatives, Life Activities, and Descendants. Prepared by Hoyt H. London, Ph. D., assisted by Virginia London, B.S. 1976. Soft or hardback covers. Over 182 pages. Not indexed. ORDER FROM: The author, 2106 Valley View Dr., Columbia, MO 65201. HB \$12.50 SB \$7.50.

The publication is an updating and addition to a 52 page booklet "A Genealogical History of One Branch of the London Family In America". This publication was about the ancestors and descendants of Charles Marion Henry London, the author's great-grandfather. The present book includes the Tefteller relatives of the writer. The book is informative, chatty and comprehensive. The author supplies, in an instructive way, the sources from which he secured his family facts.

OWINGS AND ALLIED FAMILIES. A Genealogy of Some of the Descendants of Richard Owings I of Maryland 1685-1975. Compiled by Addison D. and Elizabeth S. Owings, with the assistance of many others. 1976. Hard covers. Over 434 pages. Indexed. ORDER FROM: A. D. Owings. Rt. 1 Box 5, Terry, MS 39170. \$12.00 pp.

Richard Owings was of Welch extraction. His name is first found as Richard Owens in the Welch Tract at Merion, Pa., who with his wife, Rachel, were in the party of Hugh Roberts on the "Morning Star" in 1683. Richard and wife later moved to Anne Arundel County, Md., where they bought land. Richard was the father of one dau. and six sons: Richard, Henry, John, Robert, Samuel, and Joshua. The publication traces the descendants of these seven children. The Maryland records spelled the surname as Owens, Owings, and Owinges, a common thing in the early days of this country. The authors have added an extensive bibliography which could be useful in genealogical work.

THE LEES AND KINGS OF VIRGINIA AND NORTH CAROLINA 1636-1976 by Reba Shropshire Wilson and Betty Shropshire Glover. 1975. Hard covers. Over 186 pages. Indexed. ORDER FROM: Wilson and Glover Pub. Co., 571 Headen Dr., Ridgely, TN 38080. \$25.00.

"As America approaches the bicentennial, this civilization looks in upon itself trying, as it were, to discern the roots of its growth, greatness, and prosperity. The answer, of course, lies in the character and lives of the individual citizens who contributed so great a part to that development." So we can speak of Henry Lee and Michael King who were industrious and of good character. Both of these men were immigrants from England a short time after the establishment of Jamestown. By 1736 Henry was in York Co. and 10 yrs. later Michael was in Nansemond Co., across the James River. The authors have well authenticated the origins, places of arrival in America, and the tracing of their descendants. The story follows well that of other immigrants as they spread south and west to the new states where the Lees (Leighs) and Kings took their places with those who helped develop the new nation.

DIARY OF ELIZABETH DICK LINDSAY. Published by Gordon Gray. 1975. Hard covers. Over 91 pages. Not indexed. ORDER FROM: Mrs. Stahl Linn, Jr., Box 1948, Salisbury, NC 28144. \$18.50.

This is a facsimile edition full of illustrations and newspaper clippings. There is a map, a picture of the house, and the house plan. The introduction by Jo White Linn is informative. The house was the site of the first court of Guilford Co., NC. She was the dau. of Thomas and Jane Erwin Dick. She married Andrew Lindsay, son of Robert and Nancy McGee Lindsay. Her diary speaks of the life on a large plantation of that era. She talks of events, neighbors, relatives and everyday happenings, such as, the setting of cabbage plants, gathering of apples, work at the mill, stores and shops. She describes deaths in the family and among acquaintances and neighbors. Mary Eliza Lindsey Bowman, her daughter, continued to make entries until 1861. Mary Elizabeth began the diary in 1837.

He had two known sisters. One, Mary Margaret, married John Wright. A dau. of these two was named Mosely. The other sister married a brother of John's wife. An early VA Murrell was William of Surrey Co. The author traces the lineage back to the VA Murrells and forward to the Murrells of NC. The Murrells spread south and west, as did other families. This is a well done and interesting family Saga. Allied families: Waters, Sasser. Fuller, Walker.

The 1785 tax list is a "fragmentary tax list in the NC Archives in a box of miscellaneous papers. It is in many pieces of different sizes". The author has made some order of these loose leaves. The lists show some persons for the first time, in that the names weren't on the 1782 tax list nor on the 1790 Census. The 1800 Census for Rutherford County seems to be complete with the registrants listed alphabetically but not alphabetized within the letter. This is no problem, as the list of names is not too long.

## LETTER OF WILLIAM BROWN TO BROTHER, COLONEL JOSEPH BROWN

*Contributed by Mrs. Joan Goar Bratton, Route 4 Box 32, Oxford, Miss 38655*

James Brown, a soldier during the Revolutionary War, left his home in Guilford County, NC, intending to settle on lands near Nashville, TN. Enroute, he and two sons, James and John were killed and his wife Jane (Gillespie), sons Joseph and George, and three daughters, Jane, Elizabeth, and Polly were all taken prisoner by the Cherokee Indians. This occurred 9 May 1788. Eventually, all the prisoners were released. However, the negroes of this property were all retained by the Indians. During the 11th Congress, second session, the heirs of James Brown petitioned the government for indemnity for negroes taken by the Cherokee Indians. This was passed in the 23rd Congress and payment of the amount allowed the claims of the heirs was finally made 30 June 1834, during the 30th Congress.

The letter below was written by William Brown to his brother Joseph in order to aid Joseph in his search for these heirs of James Brown as they had had forty-six years in which to scatter in many directions. This letter was sent to the contributor by Mrs. Helen Rugeley, who is a direct descendant of Colonel Joseph Brown. The contributor descends from the John Patton mentioned in the letter, relationship to the Browns is not known.

STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, WILKINSON COUNTY

April 30, 1834

Dear Brother,

Through the mercy of our Heavenly Father the families of Brother George and my own and ourselves are well in the land of the living and enjoying a reasonable portion of common health. In consequence of the wide extent of country over which our family connection are scattered, the extreme heat of the weather, and our brother George and four neighbors had agreed to go in company to explore the lands on Red River in Louisiana (and have since gone), and my own health not being good, it has been out of my power to give them general notice; I will state their situation so far as I know. Of the Hamilton family there are but two in this part of the Country, they are James and Hannah who married a Mr. Blackman; and I sent James a notice and he had men employed in building a gin mill and he could not attend to this business at this time. I suppose John Hamilton is somewhere on the west side of the Mississippi but whether in Texas or on this side I know not. As to James Collinsworth's family they are far scattered. The last I heard from James C. Collinsworth was by a letter from him by which he informed me that he was then in the Arkansas Heights (?) and engaged in making a crop and that he expected to be (?) in this county the ensuing winter. I have not heard from him since that letter was received about two years ago. Edmund Collinsworth went with his wife's family to the West side of the Mississippi some four years past his wife died and he has been employed as an Overseer. There are four of Collinsworth's daughters alive the last that I heard from them (to wit) Mary, Luretta, Narcissa, & Margaret-Ann. Mary was not married, but she and Margaret Ann both live with Abel Waddel who married Luretta they live about 6 miles South East from Batton Rouge, (generally called Batton Roosh), Narcissa married Zachariah Waddel a brother of the husband of Luretta but he is dead and Narcissa is a poor widow with six children and very little property living in Louisiana a few miles from the South East corner of the County. William C. Collinsworth and Joseph the youngest Son were living somewhere between Vicksburg & Raymond, William follows gin building, George B. Collinsworth is dead, & David Collinsworth the youngest Son but one wrote to me about two years ago that was then Clerk on board of a steamboat

and I have never heard from him since a Short time after that.-- John Patton moved from this region about six years past into Hinds County on Big Black & never writes to us and I suppose to no other person. Of course writing to him by mail would be useless. In consequence of the stiffness of my hand from the old wound and a trembling from the weakness of my nerves I have quit writing except in cases of a very urgent nature. This explains explains the reason why I do not write to you as I ought and the reason why I know so little of our Connection as I cannot correspond with them by writing. Brother George and myself have constituted you our Attorney, and you will receive the power with this letter, and the affidavit of old (?) Major Johnson to prove George Brown & myself to be of that family. If you should find the affidavit of Major Johnson not sufficient to identify us to be of the family you can strengthen it by the Testimony of some of your neighbors who know us to be Your brothers. I think it will be advisable to leave instructions when you leave home ~~to give instructions~~ (last three words lined through) how papers that may be sent to you shall be forwarded. And that you constitute an Attorney at the City of Washington to receive such Powers of Attorney and the papers that may nessarily accompany them.

## PENSION APPLICATION OF CLEMENT MCDANIELS

STATE OF TENNESSEE, SHELBY COUNTY. On the 13th day of August personally appears before us sitting as a Called Court Col. Clement McDaniel a resident of said County and State aforesaid who first being duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following Statement and declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision rendered by the act of Congress passed June 7th 1832. That according to my fathers Register I was born in Halifax County, Virginia on the 19th of December 1759 which makes me now upwards of seventy two years of age. That in August 1776 I volunted in what was then called the minute service under Fleming Bates of Hallifax County, Captain; William McDaniel, Lieutenant; and Stephen Bates, Ensign. That I lived in Virginia in the County of Halifax and Pittsylvania until the year 1800 then moved to Metro District of Tennessee and lived there until the year 1820 when I moved to this County, where I have lived ever since.

That as soon as Capt. Fleming Bates Company was complete we had marching orders. We rendezvoused at New London in Bedford County about the first of September when and where we were formed into a Regiment Commanded by Col. Charles Lewis of Albermarl County and State of Virginia. Harris Morgan, Lieutenant Colonel and Nicholas Lewis of Albemarle, Major. Early in the month of September, we marched westward by crossin New River at English Ferry, thence to Fort Clussee (?), Thence to the Townhouse on the middle fork of Holston, thence to the long Island of Holston where all the frontier settlers were Forted in having been much harrassed by the Indians. Here we rendezvoused again and weighted until we were joined by Col. Christes Rigement of riflemen from West of the Blue Ridge Col. Joseph Williamson's Regiment from the Yadkin in the State of North Carolina. Our force in all about two thousand men. As soon as practicable we took up the line of march through the Wilderness when our movements were duly waken by the Indians as by the reports of our spys. We were in daily and hourly expectation of an attack and were more than once forced into a line of Battle but after they learnt our strength (as we supposed) they fled to their Towns and carried off their wives and children down the River in canoes. We marched on cross the River at great peril, suffering at the same time from the coldness of the night, it being toward the last of November. We lay near the River for 26 hours. Our troops were greatly afflicted with the Bowel complaint, I myself was very sick and I lost a brother and many of the troops died when we reached the Towns we found them vacated. We remained there some days during which time the Indians came in and made a Treaty of Peace. The sick were sent to the long Island of Holston and shortly after the main army followed, where we were discharged three hundred miles from home without provisions or money to buy with. In this situation we started homeward, most of us in bad health. The country through which we passed was thinly settled by the Dutch, who were quite poor and could but seldom give us anything better than sour rye bread

and sour buttermilk. The snow on the mountains was then half leg deep. A merciful God protected us and we reached our homes after an absence of about four months, having experienced all the \_\_\_\_\_ and hardships incident to an Indian Campaign. This service so affected my health that I was rended unfit for any laborious business for eighteen months or more. On a partive restoration to health I was desirous to enter this continental service, but was restrained by the interesties of my parents who thought that it would cost me my life. So eager was I to be doing something for my country that I employed two waygons in hauling folk for the army from the Board. I hauled baggage for the marching militia and sometimes furnished provisions. I was called on by the Quarter master to take command of a guard and conduct a Brigade of marching men with provisions from Richmond to Salbury, North Carolina which service I performed. The first public service after this was in the year 1781 in the character of first Lieutenant of a company of Militia of the county of Pittsylvania, Stephen Coleman, Capt. My commission was signed as I now believe by Patrick Henry, Gov. of Virginia. We marched and joined with General Green army near Guilford courthouse some short time before the battle was fought at that place and remained with his army until Honourable discharge by John Wilson Col. The regiment to which I belonged. In the successing fall I marched to Little York as first Lieutenant of a company and as adjutent to three companys, William Hicks of Pittsylvania my Captain. We reached Little York a few days after the Cornwallis march of the Seige and were formed into a regiment and placed under the command of continental officers viz Col Thomas West-weather, Col. Harderman, and Nicholas \_\_\_\_\_ Major. We continued there until the surrender of Lord Cornwallis acting in the double character as first Lieutenant of a company and as adjutent to the company Regiment after the surrender I guarded the prisoners on their round to Frederick Town in Maryland, But was taken sick at Bowling Green and being unable to proceed was there honourably discharged by Major Wood Jones of Virginia. All the commissions and discharges I ever had was Knew by me as of my consequence and of course were not preserved. I have never been on the pension role have never received any pay for any services and thereby relinquish all claims to a pension or annuity except the present.

That he has made sacreifices for the promotions of the services of his country in the double capacity of Soldier of First Lieutenant and as adjutent to a regiment and recommend him to the proper department as worthy to receive to the full interest of compensation awarded to any individual for such services as were or have been performed by him.
