Courthouses, archives and libraries are particularly busy during the vacation season; productive research time can be ensured by obtaining opening and closing schedules for the facilities you plan to use. Parking is at a premium.

The National Archives and Records Service announced that effective May 1, 1984, all requests for copies of military service records or passenger arrival records must be submitted on NATF Forms 80 and 81 respectively. A change in payment policies also took effect May 1. Researchers will be billed after requested records are located.

The first Mid-Atlantic Genealogy Conference will be held in Baltimore, Maryland, July 12-14, 1984. One program topic is Maryland and the Virginias - Discovering lives and history of the settlers through the records. For details write the Maryland Genealogical Society, 201 W. The Missouri State Genealogical Association in cooperation with the Genealogical Society of Central Missouri will present the Fourth Annual Conference on Records August 11, 1984, in Columbia, MO. BOOK REVIEWS

OF THEM THAT LEFT A NAME BEHIND-A History Of The Starnes Family by H. Gerald and Herman Starnes. 1983. Hard back. 785 pp. Indexed. Order from Now and Then Bookstore, 103 W. Franklin St., Rm. 211, Monroe, NC 28110. \$48.20.

An old and distinguished clan of immigrant Palatine Germans became frontier settlers in the English colonies circa 1709. Two of the Starnes descendants have collaborated to document the family's first 125 years and have made a thorough and systematic job of it. The family spread from the Hudson Valley into Virginia and into the Piedmont area of North Carolina. Tennessee Kentucky and Louisiana are also covered along with the Revolutionary War, War of 1812, and Civil War. Adding to the value of this history are many good photographs, maps and illustrations.

SKIDMORE Rickmansworth, England; Delaware; North Carolina and West, 1555 to 1983 by Warren and William F. Skidmore. 1983. Hard back. 623 pp. Indexed. Order from William F. Skidmore, 12017 Olympic Dr., Knoxville, TN 37920. \$28.50.

This book traces the pioneer Skidmore family from 1555 at Rickmansworth, Hertfordshire, England to Delaware in 1658, then about 100 years later to North Carolina. Some families moved from there on to Tennessee, Kentucky, Texas, Missouri, Indiana, Illinois, Iowa and elsewhere on the western frontier. In addition to the text, there are almost 400 pages of charts which list recent descendants of certain branches. This information is based on contributions from living family members and others who have been active in genealogical research on their family.

WAITING FOR THE MOMENT; Civil War-Home Front-Indiana-Northern Alabama-Middle Tennessee Campaign by Louise Booth. 1983. Soft back. 218 pp. Indexed. Order from author, 18551 Via Bravo, Villa Park, CA 92667. \$22.00.

Throughout his time in the Union Army, Basil Jewell thought of his family and friends at home in Sullivan County, Indiana. His letters to his wife, Mary L. Weir Jewell, were treasured by her and kept by her descendants. This book is really a history of Sullivan County; interwoven with a vast amount of additional information, the letters help to bring it all into sharper focus. This is an unusual and well-executed volume, a must for persons with family lines in the county and/or Civil War buffs.

BURKE COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA SURVIVING WILL AND PROBATE ABSTRACTS 1777-1910 compiled by Miles S. Philbeck, Jr. and Grace Turner. 1983. Soft back. 78 pp. Indexed. Order from Grace Turner, 600 Lynnwood Ave., Wilson, NC 27893. \$15.00.

Burke County presents a variety of research problems due to the destruction of a large number of records by Union forces during the 1860's. Some records did survive however, including a few wills, a substantial series of court minutes, some estate files, and a series of tax lists. These will abstracts follow this format: name of deviser, date of will, date of probate devisees, executors, witnesses, and additional probate information if available. In this volume the abstracts are each assigned a unique number which is used as reference in the index.

JACOB STUTZMAN (?-1775) His Children & Grandchildren by John Hale Stutesman, Jr. 1983. Hard back. 308 pp. Indexed. Order from John Stutesman, 305 Spruce St., San Francisco, CA 94118. \$20.86.

Jacob Stutzman was a "Dunker", a member of that German Anabaptist sect now generally known as the Brethern Church. He arrived in Philadelphia from Europe in September 1752, and took up land in Pennsylvania and Maryland. He and his wife, Hannah, maiden name unknown, had six known children, David, Plantina, Jacob, Hannah, Daniel, and Abraham. Their lives and families are each dealt with in a separate section in this volume. Information is given on these related families: Abbott, Baughman, Carter, Dodds, Gerhardt, Hars, Lear, McBain, McCorkle, Nesbitt, Oliver, Randolph, and Ulrich.

THE GR SYSTEM, A Method of Genealogical Research by William T. Skinner. 1983. Soft back. 50pp. 3-hole punched. Order from GR Systems, P.O. Box 1278, Matthews, NC 28106-1278. \$10.00.

The GR System was developed to offer a method of planning, collecting and documenting genealo-

gical research to aid both amateur and professional. The system is composed of fifty assorted worksheets with instructions on how to use them printed on the back of each sheet. Besides the usual pedigree, family and census charts, forms for sources, wills, deeds, etc. are included. Additional pages may be ordered as needed to supplement any section.

TENNESSEE COUNTY HISTORY SERIES, WILSON COUNTY by Frank Burns. 1983. Hard back. 130 pp. Indexed. Order from Memphis State University Press, Memphis, TN 38152. \$12.50.

As early as 1780, there may have been families living within the present boundaries of Wilson County. Beginning with those early days, Mr. Burns chronicles the county from that time to the present, looking through many different windows. He looks at county life, war times, businesses, churches, etc. Andrew Jackson had many business and land interests in Wilson County, and Sam Houston had his first law office in the town of Lebanon. This is a book to be enjoyed.

PETERS, VAUGHAN, RUSSELL AND RELATED FAMILIES by Eddie Inez Peters Holloman and Mary Lillian Peters Whitten. 1980. Soft back. 141 pp. Indexed. Order from Mrs. Holloman, 964 Avenue of The Pines, Grenada, MS 38901 or Mrs. Whitten, 308 N. Wayne St., Macon, MS 39341. \$17.00.

Three Peters brothers, William, Nathaniel and John, moved from North Carolina to Grangier County, Tennessee in the late 1700's. The Russells are traced from South Carolina to Georgia to Alabama to Mississippi. The James Vaughn family moved from South Carolina to Tennessee to Mississippi before 1820. These three families are related by marriage. Other families listed are Pyott, Hoyal, Hutcheson and Skillman. There is a very interesting chapter on the Turnipseed (Rebsamen) family. Photographs and copies of old records and letters embellish this history.

1850 RHEA COUNTY, TENNESSEE CENSUS by Willis Reed Hutcherson and Pollyana Creekmore. 1983. Soft back. 100 pp. Indexed. Order from James L. Douthat, 2504 Kell Rd., Signal Mountain, TN 37377. \$12.00.

Rhea County was created in 1807 from Roane County. The 1850 Census information included number of the household, name of each member, age, occupation and birthplace. Included in this volume is the census for the Town of Washington in 1850. Listings are arranged as found on the microfilm and are given plenty of space on the pages of this book. Surnames appear in capital letters making for easy location on the page.

HOUGH AND HUFF FAMILIES OF THE U.S. Some Huff Families of Tennessee Volume VIII by Granville W. Hough. 1983. Soft back. 88 pp. Indexed. Order from Granville Hough, 3438-B Bahia Blanca West, Laguna Hills, CA 92653. \$40.00.

Dr. Hough has published seven previous volumes of material on his family surname. This is an 8 1/2" x 11" spiral-bound reproduction of 174 smaller pages of Huff data taken from various sources. The author has used church records, court minutes, land records, census indexes, and lists of Civil War soldiers to abstract data which he then groups into family summaries. However in the preface he states, "The lineages are all suggested and are highly probable. Some, of course, may be erroneous because of the gaps in information." He also offers copies of "Diary of a Soldier in Grant's Rear Guard 1862-1863," an article he edited for The Journal of Mississippi History.

REMBERTS BY WAY OF SOUTH CAROLINA by Sallie Henrietta Rembert and L.A. "Brooks" McCall. 1979. Hard back. 781 pp. Indexed. Order from L.A. McCall, Rt. 10, Box 30, Florence, SC 29501 or 214 N. Salem Ave., Sumter, SC 29150. \$35.00.

Andre Rembert I and his wife, Anne Bressan, came to America from Pont-En-Royal in Daufine, France. Andre was #81 on the 1696 naturalization "liste" and held Lot #21 in Jamestown, South Carolina. This book begins with his will and continues with the listing of some of the descendants of each of his children, in an effort to show all of the lines in one volume. The relationship to Andre I of each person is charted by an alphabetical code. Dates of birth and marriage (as available) of each couple are followed by their children's names and vital statistics. Although few geographical locations are noted for each person, a general itinerary for each family segment is included. The book is like a road-map for current Rembert descendants, directing them back to their immigrant ancestor.

WILLIAM WEYERMAN (WIERMAN) OF ADAMS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA Descendants and Allied Families by Ernestine Parke Moss. 1983. 8½" x 11" spiral bound. 114 pp. Indexed. Order from Mrs. Moss, 658 Stonewall, Memphis, Tn 38107. \$8.00.

This book, a sequel to the author's Parke and Comegys books, is based on a variety of records gathered from Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana and Illinois. William Wierman, a young German physician, married Gertrude Sateman in Holland; they came to Adams County, Pennsylvania in the early 1700s. Their great-great-grandsons, William and Thornburgh, moved to Ohio where William married Martha Comegys in 1845. This couple moved to Douglas County, Illinois where William died in 1894 and Martha in 1900. Some allied families are: Cox, Jenkins, Griest, Baldwin, Chamberlain, Pyle, Withers, Underwood and Hooper . . . a vast amount of data for this price.

LESSLEY FAMILY RECORDS by Samuel B. Lessley. 1983. Hard back. 394 pp. Order from Samuel B. Lessley, P.O. Box 573, Claremore, OK 74017. \$32.50.

Beginning with the ancient Scottish history of this family, the author tells the story of Samuel Lessley who married Sarah Hutchinson about 1756. In 1767 he purchased land on Waxhaw Creek in Mecklenburg County, North Carolina near the South Carolina line. Their children were James, Sarah, Mary, Samuel Jr., George, and possibly Robert. This volume also deals with Sarah Hutchinson's five married sisters - one of whom was the mother of Andrew Jackson, President of the United States. A variety of type, photographs of gravestones and signatures and direct quotes from documents and diaries make this an interesting book to read.

COPPEDGE/FREEMAN AND NEXT OF KIN by Mildred C. Siever. 1983. Hard back. 323 pp. Indexed. Order from Mildred Siever, P.O. Box 697, Claremore, OK 74018. \$14.00.

The Coppedges settled first in Virginia about 1662, but descendants followed the frontier to Kentucky, Missouri and points west. There are eleven generations of the family accounted for here. This branch of Freemans migrated from Virginia and Tennessee to the Missouri, Arkansas, Oklahoma, Texas area. There are ten generations given on this family, showing related families as Craven, Dyche, Cowan, Burgess, Davis, Churchman, and many more.

RECORD OF MARRIAGES HENRY CO., TENN. 1881-1890 by Charles D. Robbins and Johnny D. Walker. 1983. Soft back. 213 pp. Indexed. Order from Mr. Robbins, P.O. Box 1122, Paris, TN 38242. \$12.00.

This book, indexed and printed by a home computer, contains all the marriages in Henry County, Tennessee during the decade of 1881-1890, a total of 2,437 marriages. The information includes the names of the groom, bride, bondsman and the date of the wedding. There is an index for grooms and one for brides. The groom index includes the name of the bondsman and the date of the marriage. In cases where the officiant failed to return the license, the date given is the date the license was issued.

REVOLUTIONARY WAR PENSION APPLICATIONS FROM FRANKLIN COUNTY, TENNESSEE abstracted by Charles A. Sherrill. 1982. Soft back. 100 pp. Indexed. Order from Mr. Sherrill, 3813 Glenwood Rd., Cleveland Heights, OH 44121. \$10.00.

This unusual reference source brings to light a wealth of information about families from Franklin and adjoining counties which has never before been published. The information has been abstracted from more than 600 original documents on file at the National Archives. These documents date from about 1818 to 1855 and most were written in Franklin County. Letters, affidavits and family records are among the sources. In addition to the 67 veterans and 27 widows, valuable information is included about more than 150 relatives and neighbours.

CROCKETT (HAYWOOD) COUNTY, TN. DEEDS 1785-1872 compiled by Maxine Mayo. 1983. Loose leaf note book. 332 pp. Indexed. Order from Ms. Mayo, 133 S. Branch, Alamo, TN 38001. \$20.00.

Crockett County, Tennessee was formed in 1872 from portions of four other counties - Haywood, Dyer, Gibson, and Madison. This book contains the deeds for the portion of Haywood that became part of Crockett and is the first in a series of four books. Each entry contains the names of the buyers and sellers of the land, the number of acres, the purchase price, a description of the property, and the deed book and page numbers. Also included is a land grant map and complete index of names and places of more than 650 families.

THE 1880 U.S. CENSUS OF CLAY COUNTY, ARKANSAS 1983. Soft back. 156 pp. Indexed. \$11.00.

THE 1900 U.S. CENSUS OF CLAY COUNTY, ARKANSAS Volume I and II 1983. Soft back. 434 pp. Indexed. \$25.00 a set. All volumes compiled by Una Pollard. Order all volumes from Ms. Pollard, Rt. 2, Box 253, Piggott, AR 72454.

1880 is the first census year for Clay County. For earlier census of the area one will have to read those of Greene County. This volume contains all the information given on the census except the number of months unemployed during the year and the education of each person. There is a map showing the location of the nine townships. Also included are mortality schedules and a complete family surname index, a listing of abbreviations used in this transcription, and information on townships within the county.

The county more than doubled in population from 1880 to 1900. All information on the census is given except education and ownership of home. Included is a map of 1900 Clay County showing the location of the eighteen townships and their populations and the nine post office towns. There is a 2,000 family surname index. In all three volumes the statistics are arranged in columns under headings as found on the original census. This format makes easy reading.

THE PRESTONS OF SMITHFIELD AND GREENFIELD IN VIRGINIA by John Frederick Dorman. 1982. Hard back. 441 pp. Indexed. Order from Nelson L. Dawson, The Filson Club, 118 West Breckinridge St. Louisville, KY 40203. \$27.50.

This volume concerns the remarkable progeny of the Preston-Patton clan. Originating in northern Ireland, these Ulster Scots came to Virginia in the eighteenth century and settled in the piedmont region. The children of John and Elizabeth Patton Preston are chronicled for five generations, listing the statistics of their lines and including their accomplishments and contributions to affairs of state. Through female descents are included the Breckinridges, Floyds, Harts, McDowell, Browns, Lewises, Blairs, Marshalls, Howards, Wickliffes, and Madisons among others. In his customary scholarly fashion, Mr. Dorman has included copious notes and sources.

NINTH CENSUS OF THE UNITED STATES 1870 HENDERSON COUNTY, TENNESSEE by Mrs. Exie Johnson Green. Soft back. 183 pp. Indexed. Order from Mrs. Green, Rt.2, Box 217 BG, Hope, AR 71801. \$16.00.

The 1870 census of Henderson County, Tennessee is now available in book form, thanks to a native of that county now residing in Hempstead County, Arkansas. Mrs. Green transcribed her book from National Archives microfilm. The dwelling house is numbered in order of visitation, giving the name of each person whose place of abode on the first day of June in 1870 was in this family. Color, sex, age, occupation, place of birth, taxable property, and other pertinent information has been compiled for the researcher.

SIX MONTHS FROM TENNESSEE by Skipper Steely. 1983. Soft back. 184 pp. Indexed. Order from The Wright Press, P.O. Box 94, Paris, TX 75460. \$13.50.

This is a history of Old Miller County, Territory of Arkansas (1816 to 1830) now northeast Texas and Southeast Oklahoma. It is based upon the life of Claiborne Wright and his family who came from Tennessee, and combines local history, genealogy and biography. Documentation does not detract from lively and readable material on many subjects. Supporting the text are photographs, well-presented maps, and charts on the lineages of Brown, Pitchlynn, Lincecum, Folsom and Fowler families.

A TYREE GENEALOGY by Forrest Hill Tyree. 1983. Hard back. 144 pp. Indexed. Order from Mr. Tyree, 4802 Jeffery Dr., Nashville, TN 37211. \$35.00.

This volume begins with James Tyree who was born in 1743 in Virginia. Married to Matilda Ballard, daughter of John Edmond Ballard and Marguerite Clere, he served in the Virginia Line as a lieutenant during the American Revolution. The Tyree plantation was General Lafayette's headquarters during the Battle of Yorktown. Basically, this book is a listing of ancestors and descendants of Cyrus Tyree, a grandson of James and Martha. Cyrus settled in Tennessee and his twelve children have each been allotted a chapter herein. Some allied lines are: Anderson, Arrington, Burns, Coulter, Courtney, Harrison, Hockaday, Johnson, Smith and Wade.

THE TRABUE FAMILY IN AMERICA 1700-1983 compiled by Julie Trabue Yates and Charles C. Trabue IV, M.D. 1983. Hard back. 515 pp. Indexed. Order from Mrs. Douglas J. Yates, 1809 Otter Creek Rd., Nashville, TN 37215. \$32.00. Tennessee residents add .50 for sales tax.

Antoine Trabue was a Huguenot who arrived in Virginia in 1700. This beautifully bound volume lists over 7,000 direct descendants and also spouses. Included are pertinent dates and places of births, deaths, and marriages of both. Some biographical sketches are given when available. Some of the allied families are: Smith, Guarrant, Dupuy, Moseley, Bryant, Watkins, Haskins, Clay, Minter, Sublett, Wooldridge, Willson and Major.

DEDMAN-DEADMON FAMILY HISTORY by Anna Laura Griffith. 1983. Soft back. 153 pp. Indexed. Order from Anna Griffith, Rt. 1, Box 306, Mayfield, KY 42066. \$20.00.

This family history begins in Virginia in 1635 and covers twelve generations. The descendants of Christopher Dedman lived in York County until 1770, when a great-grandson, Samuel Dedman, inherited land from his father, Philip, in Mecklenburg County, Virginia and the family moved there. It was about 1830 that the Dedmans migrated to Tennessee, John R. and William Howard to Hickman and Maury County. Others went to Alabama, Arkansas and other states. Some related families are Haile, Holmes, James, Johns, Jones, Griffith, McNatt, Slayden, Steele, Wade, Wester, White and Workman.

MY MCGEE AND JOYNER FAMILIES, PIONEERS, PATRIOTS, AND PREACHERS by Helen Bowling McKnight. 1983. Soft back. 218 pp. Indexed. Order from Ms. McKnight, 7702 Tree Line Dr. S.E., Huntsville, AL 35802. \$20.00.

John McGee, born in Ireland circa 1716, married secondly Martha McFarlane, heroine of the Revolutionary War, mid-wife for her North Carolina area, and a woman noted for being undaunted by any circumstances. Their five children were Jean, John, Susannah, William and Andrew. John and William became noted Methodist preachers. The Reverend John's daughter, Elizabeth, married a Methodist preacher, Thomas Joyner, thus establishing the Joyner connection. This well-documented book was produced on a computer-word processor, but its interesting content compels the eyes to adjust to unusual print.

NORTH CAROLINA GENEALOGICAL RESEARCH by George K. Schweitzer, Ph.D Sc.D. 1984. Soft back. 192 pp. Order from Dr. Schweitzer, 7914 Gleason, C-1136, Knoxville, Tn 37919. \$9.00.

Dr. Schweitzer has provided a compact, comprehensive handbook for all searchers of North Carolina records. He begins with the background of the state then gives the major repositories and lists thirty-five types of records with descriptions and source material for each type. This is followed by research procedures and a list of the 107 counties of North Carolina with the records that may be found in each one. Having this book will provide all the resources of North Carolina at the finger tips of the genealogist.

GARRETT by Paula G. Cleveland. 1983. 8½" x 11" spiral bound. 292 pp. Order from Paula Cleveland, 111 Crestway, Box 671, Yarnell, AZ 85362. \$27.50.

A detailed study of history serves as a background and introduction to the emigrant Garretts. The author offers much data on Garretts in general, such as those named in the Revolutionary War, early colonial marriages and the 1790 census of existing states. All this leads to Edward Garrett II, who married Ann West Owsley in Virginia in 1759 and then moved to Old 96 District in South Carolina in 1766. They had sixteen children and each is treated in turn. Allied families are Pickens and Beavers.

SOME BETTS FAMILY RECORDS by Mary E. Brantley. Soft back. 156 pp. Indexed. Order from Ms. Imogene Brantley, 301 E. Horner St., Atmore, AL 36502. \$10.00.

The Betts family was first found in Suffolk Sounty, England in 1272, and later in Ireland. The subject of this volume, Samuel Betts, settled in Sussex County, Delaware where his name appeared in records of 1776. About 1796 the family moved to Hancock County, Georgia where he died c1804; the next generations spread west to Alabama and other states. Some of the allied families mentioned are: Bonnette, Brantley, Evans, Fountain, Godbold, Green, Helton, Knighton, Lowery, Manci, Mosley, Ratzburg, Rumbley, Salter, Washburn.

FARRINGTON AND KIRK FAMILY 1600-1983 by Herschel B. Rochelle. 1983. Hard back. 361 pp. Indexed. Order from Mr. Rochelle, RFD 3, Box 642, Hillsborough, NC 27278. \$25.00.

The focal point of this volume is the couple Abraham Farrington (1765-1845) of New Jersey and Ohio and wife, Deborah Kirk (1781-1829) of Chester County, Pennsylvania. Abraham left a diary, passed down through generations to the writer, which describes Abraham's life as a Quaker. His grandfather of the same name was a Quaker minister of some fame in literature. The Kirks were from Ireland and also of the Society of Friends. Additional Bunting and Kirk ancestry, photographs, copies of maps and records combine to make this an informative family history. The large type and tinted paper make reading it a pleasure.

BILL'S CREEK BAPTIST CHURCH Two Hundred Year History 1782-1982 by Helen Mason Lu. 1984. Hard back. 287 pp. Indexed. Order from Ms. Lu, P.O. Box 4276, Sta. A., Dallas, TX 75208. \$25.50.

Nestled at the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains in the northwestern corner of Rutherford County, North Carolina is located the oldest Baptist Church in the county. This area is in the path of early migration, and many of these migrants stopped off in Bill's Creek. Some descendants still reside in the area today; others moved on to western States. This detailed history gives insight into the life and times of the church and its members - the way it was two hundred years ago and the way it is today. It includes biographical sketches of pastors, membership lists, cemetery inscriptions, and sketches of arms of the church which extend into Burke, Polk, and Buncombe Counties.

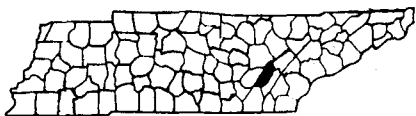
Compiled by sixteen of the country's leading genealogists, this book provides detailed information, much of it never before published, on all significant United States genealogical sources. The usual types of records, dating from Colonial times to the present, are covered in depth, and at the end of each chapter is a section designed especially for the expert researcher. New techniques are illustrated which can be used to extract fresh data from seemingly exhausted sources. The book also devotes several chapters to sources often considered to be difficult, such as Asian-American Records, Jewish-American Records, Urban Ancestor Research, Black Ancestral Research, etc.

HISTORY AND GENEALOGY OF THE HUTTON FAMILY by Harold Hutton. 1983. Hard back. 194 pp. Indexed. Order from Harold Hutton, Rt. 1, Bassett, NB 68714. \$25.00.

Even if you have no Hutton lineage, this historical description of the settlement of Pennsylvania and the migration to the west could give a vivid picture of the trials of your pioneer ancestors. This is a story of George and Charles Hutton, born in the 1750's and first appearing in Pennsylvania. During the 1790's we follow Charles and wife, Ruth, to Nashville, Tennessee; George and son, James, to Kentucky and then on to Ohio. Their descendants are listed for three and sometimes four generations. Many illustrations and maps, gathered from archives and libraries, add interest and clarification to this book.

MARRIAGES AND DEATHS FROM RICHMOND, VIRGINIA NEWSPAPERS 1780-1820 published by the Virginia Genealogical Society. 1983. Soft back. 285 pp. Bride index. Order from the Virginia Genealogical Society, P.O. Box 7469, Richmond, VA 23221. \$15.00.

This valuable addition to Virginia source books contains news from other places also. Taken from twenty-five early Virginia newspapers, each item is documented by the name, date and page number of the publication in which it appeared. Deaths are listed in alphabetical order separately from the marriages, which are listed alphabetically by grooms. Date of death, or date of publication, is often given with additional facts such as residence, age, occupation, circumstance of death or relatives. Marriage listings may list relatives of the couple, places of residence and ministers.

GEORGE BOWERS (1792-1850) BIBLE - Contributed by Mrs. William L. Cargill, Rt. 3,
Box 300, Collierville, TN 38017

In doing research for the Fayette Co Historical Society, Mrs. Cargill found that in 1825 George BOWERS deeded part of the land for the town of Somerville, TN. For a short while the town was called Bowersville in his honor, but a James BROWN of Madison Co TN also deeded land for the town. This information has been combined with the Bible records of Patrick Henry Bowers, Sr., owned by Mr. Richard J. Bowers, Jr. of Jackson, TN. Contact Mrs. A.B. Irwin, Jr., 3837 Jackson Ave., Memphis, TN 38128.

According to his tombstone, George Bowers was born in 1792 Tarborough, Edgecombe Co NC and died 14 Oct 1850 Fayette Co TN. He was probably the son of William and Chloe (LLEWELLING) Bowers. At age twenty George, his brother, Bartholomew Bowers (who later settled in Hardeman Co TN), and his brother-in law, John L. SOUTHERLAND, enlisted in the 4th and 3rd Edgecombe Co NC Volunteers. A sister, Maria Bowers, married James FLEMING and Harriet Bowers, who married Elisha B. HARRELL, may also have been his sister. George was married three time, as follows:

- m1 - Polly Southerland - died by 20 Nov 1815; no known children; she was the daughter of John Southerland who died c1801 Edgecombe Co NC and Clara Llewelling
- m2 - Jeannette Southerland (sister of Polly Southerland) - married 16 Nov 1824 Edgecombe Co NC; her date and place of death are unknown. Their children were:
 - 1. William Bowers - born c1829; died single
 - 2. Southerland Bowers - born 1834 Fayette Co TN; lived Hardeman Co TN 1880
- m3 - Mary Jane JORDAN on 11 Mar 1840 Fayette Co TN - born 15 Sep 1817 Lunenburg Co VA; died 6 May 1859; she and George are buried in a family lot just north of Somerville on what is now the John S. Wilder Youth Development Center. In 1853 J.J. POLK of Hardeman Co TN was named as guardian for the minor children and they were listed as living in his household in the 1860 Census. Mary Jane married Fendell CARPENTER later. Children of George and Mary Jane were:

WILLIAM CHARLES ANDREWS' LIFE SKETCH - Submitted by Miss Jean Williamson, 415
Military, Baxter Springs, KS 66713

Miss Williamson is the granddaughter of Thomas J. Andrews, brother of William Charles Andrews. The complete story as he wrote it is on file in our library, but it is condensed and rearranged here in order to save space. Shortly before he died at age 84, Mr. Andrews began to write his life story which remains unfinished.

I was born August 18, 1853 on Hurricane Creek, in Stewart Co., Tennessee. My mother was Louisa SETTLE, born in June 1832. She married my father, Thomas B. Andrews, in 1850 and died in 1916. I had four brothers and one sister: George W. Andrews - born 25 Feb 1855, died 10 Dec 1929; Hamilton S. Andrews (a namesake of Grandfather Settle) - born 7 Jan 1858, died 9 May 1932; Henry W. Andrews - born 11 Nov 1859, died 15 Mar 1936; Thomas J. Andrews - born 10 Oct 1861, died 19 Jul 1921; Lockey E. Andrews - born 7 Aug 1863, died 19 Nov 1935.

I know but little of my father. In 1861 he enlisted in the Southern Army and was stationed at Fort Donelson. In the winter of 1862 he had an attack of Pneumonia and was furloughed home. Late that year he rejoined his regiment, now stationed in Mississippi. At the battle of Shiloh he was severely wounded and died on his way home.

I know nothing of my Father's folks. As I remember them they were my grandparents and three uncles: David, Buck and George. About 1865 they all left Tennessee and moved into Kentucky. I never knew anything of them afterward.

After we knew that Father was dead, Grandfather Settle took charge of us and moved us to his farm on Lick Creek near Dover. After the war he moved back to town where he made brick, quarried stone and took masonry contracts. A brick yard was established on the farm where my work began. "Punch" Shemwell was the moulder, Pete Doren, a Negro, kept the mill full of wet clay and two brothers and I were off-bearers. As we grew older there was no idle time. When I was not at work in town, or in school, I was always at work on the farm. My brother George was the most important one on the farm. Brother Hamilton lived and apprenticed with a printer.

I began my school work at age six in a two room brick house with Mr. SCARBOROUGH, the teacher. School stopped during the war. In 1870 there was a school near our home taught by Mr. DAUGHERTY, but when his health failed I was selected to finish the term.

Thus began my career as a country school teacher at the age of seventeen. Through the influence and guidance of Mr. Billie HART I went to Mr. HOGAN's school in Humphreys Co TN, fifteen miles west of Waverly. I lived there for three years, working between terms to earn money for expenses. I received my first license to teach in 1873 and taught in Humphreys and Stewart Counties in the public schools until 1880.

My folks had begun to scatter and I became dissatisfied. Brother George and sister Lockety had married; Henry had gone to Arkansas; Hamilton was in Nashville, so I decided to go to Missouri with Uncle William Settle. Before that I visited my boyhood sweetheart, Miss Ella LEWIS. We pledged ourselves and I was to return for her in a year or two, but she died soon after I left. We went by river to Gayoso, MO to uncle's brother-in-law, Dr. PALMER. My cousin, Jim Settle, and I went about fifteen miles to a settlement where we found some folks we knew - Fred COOK and family and his mother, Aunt Polly Cook. Aunt Polly was my great aunt on my father's side. Uncle William Settle's wife and Dr. Palmer's wife were Aunt Polly's daughters.

I remained in that community until May 1881 when I took a boat to Memphis, but it was the wrong time to look for a job teaching. I worked at any kind of job before deciding to take a train for Little Rock. My objective was Quitman, Arkansas where my brother Henry and George Trawick were. George was a brother of Dr. Trawick, a friend of my younger days. After changing trains in Little Rock, I arrived at Kensett which was the closest stop to Quitman. I started on foot, and about ten miles from Searcy I was resting when a man in a buggy came by and offered me a ride and a job harvesting his oat crop. At the end of the job I went three miles farther to George Trawick's place.

This ends the autobiography. W. C. Andrews became ill and never recovered. The typist adds that he died about 1890 and left an "oldest" son born about 1886.

ABRAM VAUGHAN/ABRAHAM VAUGHN REVOLUTIONARY WAR PENSION - Contributed by
Mrs. C. Bruce Myers, 407 East Coy Cr., Clarksville, TN 37043

In order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress passed 7 Jun 1832 for Revolutionary War Pensions, Abram Vaughn, age 69, made the following declaration 25 Sep 1832 to John SHANE, David C. HIBBETTS and James M. MARTIN who were the presiding Justices of the Court in the town of Lebanon, Wilson Co TN.

He states he substituted in place of James WILES, who had eight months of his time to serve, on Easter Monday 1779 in the Artillery Co commanded by Capt. Peter WRIGHT and Lt. William FOWLER attached to the Regiment commanded by Cols. HARRISON & PORTER-FIELD. Abram entered the service in Dinwiddie Co VA and marched to Taylor's Fort, an old magazine in Mecklenburgh Co, and then returned home. He received his discharge about Nov 1779 after nine months in Co 6th Reg VA State Troops. He again substituted in place of William THWEATT in Dinwiddie Co VA May 1780 under Capt. George PEGRAM, Lts. Peter EPPS & William WALKER, Boswell HUTCHINGS, Ensign. They marched to Hillsborough, NC and attached to the 3rd VA Reg State Troops under Col. FALKNER ending at Ridgley Mills, SC near Camden. After the battle at Camden the troops were rallied and marched to the Guilford Courthouse where he received his discharge on Nov 1780.

About Jan 1781 Abraham substituted in place of Lody TALLY in Amelia Co VA under Capt. David CRAWLEY being transferred into Capt. Creed ASKINS' company which was attached to the Regiment commanded by Maj. William BRICE. After serving about four months he was discharged at Chesterfield Courthouse in Virginia under Capt. William LEWIS Apr 1781. Once again he substituted in place of Anthony MILES/WILES in Chesterfield Co VA Jun 1781 under Capt. Arch^d WALTHAL and attached to regiment commanded by Col. DICKS marching to Gloster Courthouse where he was discharged Oct 1781. He knows of no person except Charles CARTER who can prove his services, but he has not heard of him lately; he has no documentary evidence of his service since his discharge papers are lost.

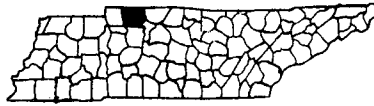
Abram (X) Vaughan

On 25 Sep 1832 Mr. William ALLGOOD, clergyman, Alexander ASTEN/ACTON and Thomas BRADLEY attested to his age and avowed service in Revolutionary War.

An amended declaration was made 25 Jun 1833 in which Abram states he was born Jan 1764 in Amelia Co VA. John BONNER, age 69(?) and Charles LOCK, age 80, swore that they had known Abram Vaughn more than 40 years in Wilson Co TN and in Virginia. He came to Wilson Co TN in 1807.

On 13 May 1832 Abraham Vaughn had made a will naming his wife, Margaret S., son, Peter B. Vaughn and grandson, Samuel EASON, as heirs. Twenty years later the widow, Margaret S. GOLD Vaughn, applied for a pension according to the Act of Congress 3 Feb 1853. She stated they were married in Wilson Co TN on 30 Apr 1832 by Thomas JOPLING, J.P. and that Abram had died 31 Jul 1836. Margaret S. (X) Vaughan

A Bounty Land Claim was made by Margaret S. Vaughan, age 53, on 5 May 1855. John DIES and Green H. HUNTER attested that she was the widow of said Abraham Vaughan. It was signed by B.T. BELL, J.P. and J.P. McClAIN, Clerk. This was approved 12 Feb 1856 for 160 acres of land, but she had died in 1855 and is buried in Jones Cemetery, Rt 3, Lebanon, TN. Margaret S. Gold was born in 1802 in Mecklenburg Co VA and was the daughter of Ephriam and Jane HAILEY Gold.

SOME DEATHS AND GRAVEYARDS ON CENTENNIAL
ISLAND AND ISLAND 37, TIPTON COUNTY, TENNESSEE

Compiled by Joanne Cullom Moore

Because of the Centennial Cut-Off, a sudden and violent change in the course of the Mississippi River in 1876, a large portion of Tipton County, Tennessee was separated from the mainland of the state. After the Cut-Off occurred, this Tennessee land was on the west (usually the Arkansas) side of the Mississippi River, where, though much changed in form, it is located today. The islands are reached by driving about eight miles from either Frenchman's Bayou or Joiner, Mississippi County, Arkansas.

There are four burying-grounds on the islands: The Barrow Cemetery, the Williams Cemetery, the 37 Graveyard, and the Corona Graveyard.

The Barrow Cemetery is located beside the main (dirt) road on Island 37. The land is presently owned by Clyde WHISTLE of Osceola, Arkansas. The approximate dimensions of the cemetery are 40 x 50 yards. A decorative iron fence separates the Barrow graves from the others.

(Sam Williams, a Negro, came from Shake Rag, Tennessee, and acquired land on the island in 1895.) The cemetery, roughly thirty three steps wide and eighty steps long, has only one concrete marker:

The graveyard is about 42 x 80 yds. The size of the trees (pecan, walnut, hackberry, and sycamore) would indicate the cemetery has been in use for some time. There is only one tombstone.

Two men completely burned up in house-fires on Corona--a Mr. Minch (white) in the 1950s and Alfred Mullens (black) in December 1962.

During the Flood of 1937, at least one man who drowned in the floodwaters was buried on the big mound built by George SCOTT, Dillard & Coffin Co.'s agent, because the mound was about the only land in the area not covered by the Mississippi River.

THE MASTER SURNAME INDEX

The MASTER SURNAME INDEX contains thousands of cards representing individuals in the family trees of our subscribing and active members, and is maintained by the Tennessee Genealogical Society to help its members with their research. It is not restricted to any particular locality, but covers families who lived in various European countries as well as every state in the United States.

The Society does not do extensive family research for you; however, we can send you information from this file which could be very useful. The information includes data from the card(s) and names and addresses of those working on the same surname. Three surnames may be requested each time, but location must be included for common names such as Jones, Smith, Johnson etc. This service (offered only to subscribers) may be obtained by writing the Tennessee Genealogical Society, P. O. Box 12124, Memphis, Tennessee 38182-0124. Always send a stamped, self-addressed envelope with each request. You can make this file work for you by sending a 3"x5" index card, typed or plainly printed, for each member of your family tree. Use only 3"x5" cards--cards of any other size will not fit our file. Each card should contain at least one date and one place, even if they are estimated. This will enable us to distinguish a person who lived in one area in the 17th century from another with the same name who lived in another area in the 19th century. List names and birthdates of the subject's children on the back side of the index card. For example:

The Society also encourages members to send 5-generation Family Charts, which should always be accompanied by 3"x5" cards for the Surname Index.

Keep your address current with the Surname Index secretary to assure that all correspondence on your surnames from other researchers will reach you promptly.

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
