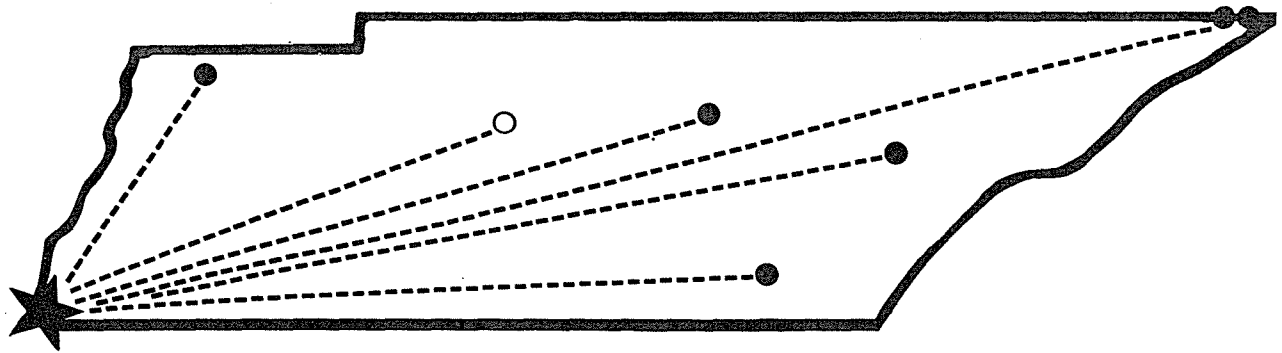

RICHARD HENSON - Application for Revolutionary War Pension - R #4909 -
Submitted by James T. Goodbread, R R #1, Cleveland, OK 74020

Newton Co., Missouri, 18 March 1845, Richard HENSON, an old man, believing himself to be 95, infirm, and who could neither read nor write, having been duly sworn according to law, said that by reason of old age and loss of memory, he could not swear precisely as to the length of his service, but stated that he served at least six months.

He made the following declaration: "That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers...that he entered service in Wilks Co, NC on Naked Creek, near the head of New River, in the fall of the year 1776 or 1777." He volunteered as a private in Capt. William NAUL'S Company, under Lt. GREEN and Ensign George BAKER. He marched from where he lived to Salisbury; was stationed there and threw up intrenchments and picketed the fort. He served 3 months, was discharged and went home.

On his first tour he believes that one or two years before he entered the service of the United States, he was called by Col. CLEVELAND to volunteer to run the line between the states of North Carolina and Virginia. He said he volunteered and had his name entered in the Company of Capt. Absolem Cleveland as a private. "We met and marched near the head of Holsten (Carters Valley) where we was put under Captain HENDERSON, and there guarded the surveyors until they run the line, Col. WILLIAMS commanding us." He served 3 months, was discharged and went home.

Henson served in no Continental Regiments, unless there were Continental officers and soldiers that brought British prisoners to Salisbury, where he served what he now says was his 2nd tour of service. He has no documentary evidence of his service, and he knows of no person living that can prove all of his Revolutionary service. Signed Richard X (his mark) Henson
Wit: William Hart, JP

Thomas SHOCKLEY, Clergyman, and James BEEMAN attested that they were well acquainted with Richard Henson, and they believed him to be 95 years of age and that he had served in the Revolutionary War as he stated.

Martha MAY also swore "that she had been acquainted with Richard Henson, since she was 6 years old because she is his sister; that she can remember of going with her father to see her brother Richard, and her other two Brothers about to go against the British in the Revolution, in Wilkes Co, North Carolina." She was then about 14 years of age. She thinks the brothers were gone about 3 months on that tour of duty.

Hart attests that Henson is indigent, unable to attend any Court of Record, is unable to walk or to stand alone and that the County Justice lives at least 18 miles from his place of residence.

During the proceedings Justice Hart asked Richard Henson a number of questions. The self-explanatory answers given are listed below:

1. I was born in Caroline Co., Virginia in 1760.
2. I have no record of my age.
3. I was living in Wilkes Co., NC when I entered service in the Revolutionary War. After the Rev. War, I moved to Clench River; thence to Clay Co., KY; thence to Illinois; thence to Indiana; thence to Calloway Co., KY; thence to Hardeman Co., TN; (A Richard Henson was shown as head of household, aged 70-80 in 1830 Census) thence to Desoto Co., MS; thence to IZARD Co., AR; thence to Newton Co., MO where I now reside.
4. I volunteered for service in the Revolution.
5. I served under Col. Cleveland & under Col. Williams.

6. I do not recollect receiving a written discharge.
7. Answer - Thomas SHOCKLEY & James BEEMAN. [Affidavits from friends of long standing]

Congressman Milton SEXTON of Missouri recommended that a pension be granted to Richard Henson. The pension petition was rejected for lack of proof of service.

WILLIAM STEWART - Seminole War Land Warrant - Memphis/Shelby County,
Tennessee Archives, 33 S. Front St. Memphis, TN 38103
Estate File #205, 1855

State of Tennessee, County of Shelby -

"Petitioners H. M. Stewart, N. R. WILLIAMS and wife Sallie Williams show that on 7 Oct 1851, a Land Warrant (No. 17184) was issued for eighty acres, to William Stewart for services rendered in the Seminole War; after the reception of the Warrant William Stewart lost or misplaced the same so that he was unable to find it. He applied to the Pension Office under the laws provided in such cases and on 19 June 1855, a duplicate of original warrant was issued to Stewart.

Your petitioners further state that William Stewart departed this life in Arkansas about the last of August or 1st of September 1855, and that they, the said H. M. Stewart and Sallie Williams, are the only heirs, that the said William Stewart died intestate, and that they are above the age of twenty one years.

S. M. GATES ESTATE - Letters Express Divergent Views of the Civil War -

Memphis, TN 38103, Estate File #4327, 1881

The first letter is from W. M. RAMSEY of Cincinnati, Ohio, husband of Fannie (Mary Francis) Hart Ramsey, former ward of S. M. Gates of Memphis, TN. She was a sister to Virginia Waldo HART and William Wolcott Hart Jr., both wards of Gates.

Cincinnati, May 1st '61

S. M. Gates, Esq.

"Dear Sir; - Your letter inclosing one for Virginia arrived some days since. I acknowledge upon her behalf - she having been and still being about at Marietta - the receipt of a check upon Commercial Bank for \$100.00 which was promptly honored. She will send you a formal receipt when she returns.

Fannie is very much distressed in view of the subject of Willie's two letters just received. Whatever may be the merit of the present controversy - which is about to deluge the land in blood - we regard the position of the Confederate States as wholly without justification. The leaders of the secession movement, at least Davis and Stephens, well know that the rant of Black Republican politicians have no sincerity in it; they knew that it was merely the trick of empty Demagogues to elevate themselves to power... They have made fearful miscalculations. The trade, commerce and manufactures in which they supposed us to be so busily engaged have been abandoned in an hour. The pursuit of wealth, in which we were supposed to be wholly empowered, has been relinquished cheerfully as instantly, and the accumulations of years poured with a lavish hand upon the sacred altar of our country. The loyal States are asked for 75,000 men in the aggregate. Ohio alone responds in ten days with more than 81,000! She is not asked for one dollar yet

she gives three millions from her State treasury while every incorporated city and village in the state gives in proportion...

I hope you all receive this as it is intended - in the most kindly spirit and with a desire to avoid saying that which could prove offensive to yourself personally. As Tennessee has not formally declared war against us I presume that you will incur no risk in receiving this, and at any rate, your loyalty to Tennessee which I do not condemn is above suspicion. I will allow Fannie to finish.

The following letter was written by S. M. GATES to his ward, Virginia HART.

"Dear Virginia.

Memphis T. July 5th 1863

Yours of Mch 28th, I saw advertised in yesterday's paper and called for today. And now (at the late hour of 11 o'clock at night while the cannons of those who have made desolate my home, frown around me, watching as I have for the past year through weary hours of night, over my little ones with only one puny arm to resist those whose name is legion) do I commence the attempt to answer. Then my dear girl, how, how shall I direct my pen. . . May I speak of my poor bleeding country: whose desolated cities, villages and homes, fire blackened fields and forests, outraged humanity cries aloud to an avenging and just God. May I speak of my own dear loved ones at home over whom I have lingered over three hundred sleepless nights? Shall I tell of their perils, of their fears, hopes and sorrows? But God grant, Virginia, that we be spared even here on earth to unbosom ourselves in these things to each other. Virginia you seem to think that I have wronged you,... Of my wrongs to you, Virginia, I know them not, as God knows the every emotion of my heart. He knows it has ever yearned towards you and your sister with deep affections (I feel I can truly say) of a parent. That circumstances have intervened to prevent my ever acting the part toward you that I could have desired, I am ready to confess. But of any act of mine towards you, your brother and sister which brings one pang of condemnation, I am insensible. In the matter of letter writing, you had failed to reply to my last three, tho' two of them even required a prompt reply in a business way... You remember that for now going on three years that dark portentous clouds of adversity have hung over me and mine.... Terrific storms of desolating war have been and still are expanding themselves around me, wasting and destroying the garnerings of many years of pain & toil. Myself a wreck in health, years, and almost in worldly needs, and "I have wronged you, deeply wronged you", oh, Virginia how grating this day comes. But I will not chide, let my aim be, only to extenuate my seeming wrong.

One word to business, God knows that I wish your affairs in which I have acted as your guardian were closed. Now when they will be, I know not, I have considerable property which the Federals cannot destroy. I have considerable money but its worth all hangs upon the Confederate States being capable of maintaining itself, if it goes down then much more is lost to me. Yet in any event I shall have property enough to meet every liability, unless the country goes to utter destruction. So soon as I can make available I shall bring your matters to close and settle up. I have now white men working on my farm, and I am not without hope that I can pay you something from the crops. I shall be dependent upon it for support to my own family, if it fails me? I shall have to bear considerable suffering. . . There is about \$2800.00 in money coming to the estate, the larger portion of which belongs to you. Rest assured it shall come as soon as possible. I will now bring this letter to a close, Virginia, you but illy realize, you cannot realize, the great uncertainty of life with which my life and that of my family are surrounded. I indeed feel that an interposing providence has again and again shielded us and our little ones. On an occasion, 1/4 of a minute's time saved 4 of my little ones from the musket ball wantonly fired into my dining room. They had just gotten out

little ones. On an occasion, 1/4 of a minute's time saved 4 of my little ones from the musket ball wantonly fired into my dining room. They had just gotten out of their chairs at the table, the line of the ball would have killed all four. Once they fired at me in my own house, after offering unmentionable insults, the ball passed an inch or two in front of my breast but did not hit me. But I could not begin to enumerate to you the trying scenes through which we have passed. My wife joins as do the children in sending love to you and Fanny. We have another born to us on 8th of March. His name is Lee Jackson (GATES). May God bless you in the prayer of

S. M. G.

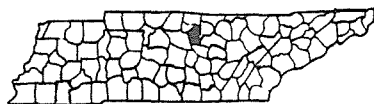
This is a true abstract from the family record of W. W. Hart family--S. M. GATES. Note: Wm W. Hart Jr. Second was not named until after the death of his father and mother, consequently he was named for his father in accordance with the wishes of his sisters.

SNAKE BITE REMEDY - Article from the Tennessee Baptist

Submitted by R. P. Baker, 6526 Magnolic, Mabelvale, AR 72103

On the 16th of September 1855, my son (Griffin Wright) aged 8 years, while traveling a small path, near a creek was bitten by a Copperhead snake. He immediately notified a younger brother, who was behind him, of the snake; and then repaired to an open place-and after squeezing out, a drop of the poison, (as he supposed) sucked and squeezed the parts for some time, and then hastened home, being near a half mile distant. His mother, (I being absent) bound a poultice of tobacco, thoroughly wet, to the wound, and gave him a tea cup, two thirds full, of Madeira wine, with a table spoonfull of pulverised Cayenne pepper, well mixed, in two portions - The first immediately after it was prepared; and the other, in half an hour thereafter. The pain he was laboring under ceased immediately after taking the last portion. The leg on which he was bitten, was much swollen the next day and too sore to walk upon; but the third day, he walked about well, and as cheerful as ever.

We deem it advisable to give this case to the public, inasmuch as others may meet with the like misfortune. And the remedy is so plain and simple, and shows the great necessity for immediate action when one is bitten, and the good effect of squeezing the parts: it will not only force a portion of the poison out, but holds it in check until it can be sucked out; and the compression of the capillary vessels will prevent the poison from passing, into the larger blood vessels. 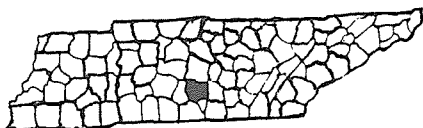

*Abstracted from Tennessee State Library and Archives Microfilm**Legislative Petitions 1799-1801, Roll No. 1**(Continued from Winter 1992 issue)*

22-1-1801 Petition of Barchias COPE, a constable of Blount County in 1799, for compensation for expenses incurred in escorting Prettyman JONES and Isaac CHARLES from Blount Co to the District Jail in Knoxville.

Another petition bearing the same number comes from Ephraim PAYTON and John DELOACH, who on 10 Nov 1796 made a contract in which Payton conveyed to Deloach 400 acres of land in Sumner County on the West fork of Station Camp Creek and also two negroes, some stock and household furniture. Deloach agreed to "provide for the said Payton's family a genteel Support & Maintainence, and cause each of his children to be liberally educated, and on their arriving to the age of Maturity to pay each child (there being five children) One hundred pounds Virginia Money..." It has become "impracticable" for Deloach to comply with the agreement, and both parties want to dissolve the contract. Both men ask for passage of "an act to exonerate the said Deloach from that part of the contract a agreement which relates to, or respects the children of the said Payton..." Signed by Ephraim Payton, John Deloach, John GARDNE and William Payton. 19 Oct 1801 (14 pages)

23-1-1801 Petition of sundry inhabitants of Grainger County, north of Clinch River, to form a new county because of their difficulty in traveling to the Court House. [Ed. See Vol. 39, No. 4, 1992 for another Grainger Co petition.] Signed by:

24-1-1801: This film is a continuation of the above Greene County requests. At a meeting of citizens of Greene County at the Court House on 19 Sep 1801 for the purpose of instructing their Representatives in the next General Assembly, Moses MOORE served as chairman and William WILSON as secretary. Their instructions concerned some variation in the six subjects above, but they added "That the Divorce Law Be appealed."

25-1-1801: A petition for the General Assembly to restore the rights and privileges of citizenship to John WILSON Jr "late of Washington County" who was convicted of horse stealing sometime in 1789. He was "cropt whipt" and branded; Joseph Wilson, Samuel Wilson and William Wilson were "pillered" at the same time for the same offense. However, the following signers believed them to be innocent and that they were convicted "by false testimony to save the guilty person." Signers were:

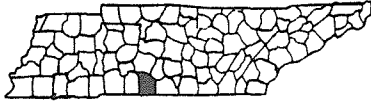

REVOLUTIONARY WAR PERIOD BIBLE, FAMILY AND MARRIAGE RECORDS VOLUME 13 by Chan Edmondson. 1992. Soft back, 5x8, 147 pp. Order from author, P.O. Box 141235, Dallas, TX 75214-1235. \$15.00. TX residents add \$1.24 sales tax.

The primary objective of this series is to abstract the birth, marriage and death records from the pension applications. The soldier's pension application usually contains information pertaining to his military service only whereas the widow's pension application contains more genealogical information. Therefore, the concentration of this series is directed to the applications of widows. The widow not only had to furnish proof of service, but also other information such as her name, age, residence, death date of husband, and marriage date and place. Lacking marriage proof, in some instances the birth date of their first child is supplied. (This is a continuation of the series previously published by Helen M. Lu and covers "Soldier: Foulkrod-Gehret").

LOYAL MOUNTAIN TROOPERS-THE SECOND AND THIRD TENNESSEE VOLUNTEER CAVALRY IN THE CIVIL WAR *Reminiscences of Lieutenant John W. Andes and Major Will A. McTeer* by Charles S. McCammon. 1992. Hard cover, 5x8, 386 pp, indexed. Order from Blount County Genealogical & Historical Society, P.O. Box 4986, Maryville, TN 37802-4986. \$30 plus \$2 S&H.

These accounts are more than just war stories - they are a documented source of information for searchers of family history. The "reminiscences" appeared in serial form in the Knoxville, TN DAILY CHRONICLE 1878 -1880. Included are rosters and stories combining camp life, skirmishes, battles, capture and imprisonment written when the events of the war are reasonably fresh in the minds of the two officers.

THE HISTORY OF NEWBERRY COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA VOLUME 1: 1749-1860 by Thomas H. Pope. 1973. 1992 reprint. Hard cover, 6x9, 389 pp, indexed. \$39.95. VOLUME 2: 1860-1990 by Thomas H. Pope. Hard cover, 6x9, 549 pp, indexed. \$39.95. Order from the University of South Carolina Press, 1716 College Street, Columbia, SC 29208.

Pope provides a detailed survey of all aspects of life in Newberry County, and the variety and quantity of primary sources used is impressive. This local history offers the reader much biographical material which is not available elsewhere. Vol.1 includes material from the whole Ninety-Six District before it was cut into six counties. The two volumes explore two distinct periods of South Carolina history, from settlement to 1860, and from the beginning of the Civil War to the present day.

The author has published four books on specific Hutchins families in the past twenty years. This massive book work contains histories and charts of all the Hutchins-Hutchings-Hutchens-Hutchin-Houchins families who were among the earliest colonists in America. Many of the descendants of these early settlers are shown down to the present generation in the extensive charts. While the body of the book is clearly printed, some of the charts and the index are in a much smaller type.

ASSUMPTION PARISH LA ORIGINAL CAHIER RECORDS, BOOKS 1 THRU 5, 1786 - 1813 by Kenneth B. Toups. 1991. Soft cover, 8x11. 114 pp, indexed. Order from author, 707 Hwy. 304, Thibodaux, La 70301. \$20.00 postpaid.

Mr. Toups has translated and abstracted French land records from the time of the Valenzuela District (Spanish Province) to the establishment of LaFourche County (Territory of Orleans) to it's separation into Assumption and LaFourche interior parishes, providing information not previously available to researchers who are not equipped to do such translation. While these records primarily contain information on land purchases and sales in the present day parishes of Assumption, LaFourche and Terrebonne, many references are made to other parishes, cities and towns as well as other states and countries.

THE FAMILY OF LEOPOLD AND BERTHA (KLAUS) HAAS, OF RULZHEIM, PFALZ, GERMANY 1758-1992 by Zelia H Cline, 1992. Soft cover, 8x11, 98 pp, indexed. Order from Glimpses of Yesteryear, 7075 High-

This interesting family history is based on a collection of information from many sources. The Haas and Klaus families were first united in 1877 when Leopold Haas married Bertha Klaus. Some family members emigrated to the United States, formed families and thrived in their new homeland but many members of these two families perished in concentration camps during the Nazi era. Two of Bertha Klaus Haas' brothers settled in Chattanooga, TN. Using a serial numbering system, the author has clearly set forth many generations.

CHICKASAW NATION, INDIAN TERRITORY (OKLAHOMA) MARRIAGE BOOKS A & B by Sandra Tedford. 1992. Soft cover, 8x11, 93 pp, indexed. Order from author, 400 Sherry Lane, Farmersville, TX 75442-1538. \$15.00 plus \$2.00 S&H. TX residents add \$1.09 state tax.

The Chickasaw Nation included all or part of twelve present day counties: Bryan, Carter, Garvin, Grady, Jefferson, Johnston, Love, McClain, Marshall, Murray, Pontotoc and Stephens. More than 2,300 marriage applications have been transcribed from a microfilm copy of the original record. These records include the name, age, place of residence of both the bride and groom and name of the presiding official. All dates are the date the marriage occurred, some as early as 1894. Many out-of-state persons are listed.

MORE KECKS OF CLAIBORNE COUNTY, TENNESSEE by Virginia Billingsley Fletcher, assisted by Homer Craft Keck. 1992. Hard cover, 6x9, 303 pp, full name index. Order from the author, 721 NW 73 Avenue, Ft. Lauderdale, FL 33317. \$29.00 plus \$3.00 S&H.

This is the author's second book of Kecks of Claiborne County, Tennessee. Divided into four sections; three focus on William, Henry and Matthew, sons of John Keck, Sr. and Ann Ousley. One focuses on Jacob Sowder, soldier at Valley Forge, and an ancestor of many Claiborne County families, several of whom married into the Keck family. Numerous family photographs are supplied. The outline format with clear type and generous use of white space makes the book a joy to use and a treasure for the many descendants of this extended family.

Further notations are shown for additional information available from the National Archives.

America's shores, to Manakintowne, Virginia, to North Carolina and then Tennessee is much more fascinating than reading a novel. Of additional interest is the computer-generated lineage chart, containing 980 direct-line descendants and measuring 13 feet, 7 inches long; it is offered for sale by the author for \$15.00.

Folksy, interesting and amusing family stories, submitted by the actual families to John Lair's news articles in the Mt. Vernon Signal during the period 1972-1977, have been edited by J. Allen Singleton of Berea, Kentucky. The language and style of Mr. Lair's writing has been retained and paired with many wide-eyed pictures of early ancestors. There is rich family information contained in the brief chapters which is not documented but provides clues for researchers of the 51 families mentioned.

Originally published in weekly installments in the Guntersville Democrat in 1902, Johnston's memoirs appear for the first time in book form. Edited and annotated by Charles Rice, the book contains a complete muster roll, listing hundreds of Confederate soldiers from Alabama and Tennessee. An introduction sets the scene and tells the story of the Methodist Episcopal (South) minister who was a hero to Southern soldiers and citizens and a dangerous opponent, to be shot on sight, to his enemies.

Included are over 500 descendants of Patrick Henry; Revolutionary, Confederate and US Soldiers, Governors, Congressmen, Slave Traders, a President, Duelists, Merchants, Preachers, Texas Rangers and even an Asphalt Salesman.

Amelia County was created in 1735 from Prince George County, Virginia and a small portion of Brunswick County, Virginia. In 1789 Nottoway County was cut off from Amelia County; therefore some Nottoway records are listed. Deeds from three Deed Books are included in this one volume. It is very apparent that Mr. McConnaughey gave much thought to ease of use when he prepared his book; the type is large and beautifully clear and, even better, the index contains boldface numbers when they refer to the page number for principals of each document.
