

#### Meet Byron Crain

Current TNGS Director At Large, **Byron Crain**, joined the Society in 1990. He has also served on the Board as Business Manager and had two separate four-year stints as President of TNGS. Byron has always stepped up to the plate whenever there was a need. Countless times he has been available to set up and take down tables, chairs and equipment for events. He never hesitated to go and pick up large donations to the Society and the library. Byron volunteered every Monday for ten years to keep the GRHGC open to the public.

Born and raised in Little Rock, Arkansas, Byron was a middle child, with one sister and one brother. He graduated with a Business degree from Little Rock University where he was President of the student body. Byron and his wife Virginia have three children--two sons and a daughter who passed away about ten years ago.

As a sonarman in the U.S. Navy, Byron worked on the USS Valley Forge aircraft carrier in Norfolk, Virginia, and throughout the Caribbean, Mediterranean and North Atlantic. He helped to protect the carrier and picked up pilots from the ocean who missed their target.

Byron began working in the grocery business as a youngster in Paducah, Kentucky, working in his aunt and uncle's grocery store. In high school, he worked for Safeway, and in college he began his career with Kroger. While working for Kroger, Byron held many positions and lived in Cincinnati, Dayton, Dallas and Memphis. After 36 years at Kroger, Byron retired in 1992. When he retired, he was the President of the Grocery Manufacturing Division, which produces Kroger's private-label brands.

#### Update on the Progress of the GRHGC Cataloging Project



If you will recall, there is a massive cataloging project taking place at the Germantown Regional History and Genealogy Center. The purpose of the cataloging project is to repair and update the online catalog records for the materials currently housed in our library so that you will have an easier time of finding what you're looking for.

**Octavia Ashby, Tina Sansone** and **Sylvia Harris** are currently working on the project. As of June 4, 2019, they, along with former employee Caroline Floyd, have now re-cataloged 6,773 books from the start of the project. That's 4,774 books since the last report to members in the Fall 2018 newsletter.

The additional states that have been completed since the last report are California, Nevada, Alaska, Hawaii, Montana, Wyoming, New Mexico, Nebraska, Kansas, Oklahoma, Iowa, Michigan, Mississippi, Georgia, Florida, Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Connecticut, New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, West Virginia and Virginia!

Octavia is currently working on the counties of Middle Tennessee with about one quarter of them completed. Sylvia is currently working on South Carolina with about two-thirds of them completed. Tina is currently working on North Carolina with about two-thirds of them completed.

## **Announcing Special Interest Groups**

As a part of our continuing efforts to provide a wide and varied base of educational opportunities to our membership, TNGS is happy to announce the creation of Special Interest Groups (SIGs). A Special Interest Group (SIG) is a means by which a small group of people can come together, discuss, and share information about a specific subject of interest. SIGs are led by a facilitator, not a presenter. The facilitator will expedite the discussion of the topic, as the group shares ideas and techniques and ultimately chooses the particulars of the next meeting.

Initially there will be two SIGs, one concentrating on **DNA Testing**, facilitated by **Debbie Atchley**. The other SIG will be for those interested in using **Family Tree Maker Genealogical Software**, and will be facilitated by **P.Z. Horton**. The goal of the **DNA SIG** is to have members share successes and questions to increase the understanding of genetic genealogy within the group. Staying up to date on new tools used to analyze DNA results will also be a goal of this group. The focus of the Family Tree Maker Special Interest Group **(FTM SIG)** is to help members take advantage of the many features and options of the software program.

In order to accommodate the groups, the format of our "Let's Discuss It" workshops will be modified. First, the "Let's Discuss It" sessions will begin at 9:30 a.m. and last until 10:30 a.m. At 11:00 a.m. the SIG session will begin and conclude at noon, as a separate session. As such, it will require a separate registration. The new format will begin with the Saturday June 22<sup>nd</sup> meeting and will continue for the balance of the year. You will find additional events now listed on our website for the SIG sessions. If you are already registered for "Let's Discuss It," you will only need to register for any of the SIG sessions you wish to attend.

Handouts and other documents of interest will be posted to the individual SIG pages after the sessions.
